Dixie National Hosts Quarter Horse Show

The Dixie National Quarter Horse Show and Equine Expo is not just for horse enthusiasts.

"This is great family entertainment," said Tommy Andrus, chairman and show manager for the Dixie National Quarter Horse Show. "People from all over the country come to compete in this show. It really is something to see, even if you don't know much about horses."

The seven-day horse show runs February 12-18 at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds in Jackson. Also called The Southern Classic, the event is the largest Quarter horse show in the South and the third

largest in the United States. It draws competitors of all ages from across the country.

According to Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce statistics, the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo brings 3,500 horses to the fairgrounds each year. Mississippi is home to about 126,000 horses, which create an economic impact of \$1.15 billion per year. Most of those horses are used for recreation and showing.

"Events such as the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo are premier agriculture-related events that contribute significantly to the state's economy and showcase some of the wonderful events Mississippi has to offer," said Rachel Carter, a specialist in the Center for Government and Community Development with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "On average, equine competitors alone spend more than \$300 per day when participating in an event, and this does not include the nearly 50 percent who stay in local hotels."

For the Dixie National Quarter Horse Show, organizers expect more than 2,000 entries in about 200 classes with around 1,500 horses qualifying for competition. Children, amateurs, and professionals compete.

The horse show is open to the public, and most events are free. Audiences can see everything from speed trials, such as barrel races, to halter classes, such as showmanship.

Horse Show

Horse show events kick off February 12 with roping competitions, which display competitors' skills in herding and tying cattle. On February 13, pleasure riding classes and reining classes will show in the equine center while halter classes and Western pleasure classes show

in the coliseum.

Trail riding and other pleasure riding classes begin on February 14. English riding classes and speed events occur on February 15 and 16. The show closes with the National Cutting Horse Association competition on February 17 and 18.

Shows occur simultaneously in the Kirk Fordice Equine Center and the Mississippi Coliseum.

Freestyle reining

Freestyle reining is the most popular event in the show lineup and is February 14.

"We always fill the coliseum with this show. Riders do different skits with their horses. Some are funny. Some are serious. But they are all visually stunning and very entertaining," Andrus said.

The freestyle reining show is the only event that requires admission. General admission tickets go on sale February 14 at 5 p.m. Doors open at 6 p.m. Opening ceremonies begin at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$5, and children under 6 years old are admitted free.

Equine Expo

Held in conjunction with the Dixie National Quarter Horse Show, the Equine Expo offers 65,000 square feet of shopping in the Trade Mart February 12-16. More than 100

vendors offer the latest fashions and trends in the equine industry, including horse tack, show clothing, furniture, jewelry, trucks, tractors, trailers, and more. The expo also features a food court and free, live entertainment.

Expo hours are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. February 12-15 and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. February 16. On February 14, the expo will be open after the free style reining show for Moonlight Madness from 9 to 11 p.m.

Although many expo merchants sell equestrian gear, others offer products the general public will be interested in, Andrus said.

"Between the horse show and the expo, we have something that everyone can enjoy," Andrus said. "Because of the national exposure the show gets, it is a gathering place for the top horses in the country and a true display for spectators."

Other Events

The Southern Classic Horse Sale begins at 10 a.m. February 15 in the Trade Mart. West Kentucky Horse Sales, Inc., will sell Quarter horses and paint horses from across the country.

The Southern Classic also hosts the Equestrians with Disabilities Show on February 4.

The show is open to participants who are physically and mentally challenged. The competition is approved by the American Quarter Horse Association and open to all breeds. Slow Cooking Crockpot Recipes



Perfect Southern Greens

1 bunch kale
1 bunch beet leaves –or–
1 bunch collards, mustard, turnip greens
1 large onion, sliced
1 tablespoon olive oil
2 garlic cloves, minced
2 jalapeno peppers, minced (discard seeds for less heat)
1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
1/4 cup cubed ham (try the prepackage mini cubes)
3 slices bacon
2 1/2 cups water (more if needed)
Salt and pepper to taste
Balsamic vinegar (optional)

Tear greens into large pieces and disregard the thick vein. Add greens to a pot of boiling salted water; let boil for about 6 minutes. Drain and rinse. While the greens are boiling, preheat a heavy skillet with olive oil, add onion and garlic; sauté until onions are lightly browned. Add minced jalapeno peppers and cook for an additional minute or two. Put the sautéed onions in the slow-cooker and stir in the drained greens, ham, bacon, crushed red pepper and water. Cook on high for 4 hours or until greens are tender. Serve with balsamic vinegar if desired.

Crock Pot Baked Potatoes

10-12 small baking potatoes
Aluminum foil

Stab potatoes with a fork, wrap with foil, and place in crock pot. Cover and cook on high for 2 1/2 to 4 hours; do not add water. Cooking time depends on how large the potatoes are so just use your best judgment, but they turn out great if cooked for 4 hours. For large potatoes, cook them on low heat for 8 to 10 hours and they will turn out perfectly.

Easy Crock Pot Macaroni and Cheese

1/4 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2 tablespoons minced onion
1/2 teaspoon paprika
3 cups milk
1 cup grated cheddar cheese (or favorite cheese)
2 cups uncooked elbow macaroni

Spray crock pot with non-stick spray for easy cleaning. In a saucepan, combine the first 5 ingredients. Pour in milk and whisk until no lumps remain. Heat and continue stirring until mixture boils and is thickened. Add cheese and macaroni; stir until well mixed. Pour mixture into 3 1/2 – quart crock pot; cover and cook on low for 2 to 2 1/2 hours or on high for 1 hour.

Jambalaya for the Crock Pot

12 ounces boneless skinless chicken breasts
1 1/2 cups green peppers, chopped
1 medium onion, chopped
2 celery ribs, sliced
4 garlic cloves, minced
1 14-ounce can whole tomatoes
1/3 cup tomato paste
1 10 1/2-ounce can beef broth
1 tablespoon parsley
1 1/2 teaspoons basil
1/2 teaspoon oregano
1 teaspoon Tabasco sauce
1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 pound shrimp, shelled
3 cups cooked rice

Cut chicken into 1-inch pieces. Put all ingredients (EXCEPT shrimp and rice) in crock pot; cover and cook on low for 8 hours. Add shrimp the last 20 minutes of cooking. Stir in the rice just before serving.

Slow Cooker Beef Short Ribs

1/3 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2 1/2 pounds boneless beef short ribs
1/4 cup butter
1 cup chopped onion
1 cup beef broth
3/4 cup red wine vinegar
3/4 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup chili sauce
2 tablespoons ketchup
2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
2 tablespoons minced garlic
1 teaspoon chili powder

Combine flour, salt and pepper in a bag; add ribs and shake to coat. Brown ribs in butter in a large skillet, and then place them in the slow cooker. In the same skillet, combine the remaining ingredients bringing mixture to a boil, stirring. Pour mixture over ribs; cover and cook on low for 9 hours.

Crock Pot Candy

1 16-ounce package dry roasted salted peanuts
1 16-ounce package unsalted dry roasted peanuts
1 12-ounce package semi-sweet chocolate bits
1 4-ounce German chocolate bar
32 ounces white almond bark

Put peanuts in the bottom of the crock pot; add the other ingredients. Cook mixture on low setting for 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Place rounded spoonfuls onto wax paper and allow to cool.



The Contribution of The Mule

My daddy grew up plowing with mules on their family farm. They had a small cotton crop, a garden to eat from, and a few dairy cows. I've always been fascinated by the stories about the mules and horses they worked.

Mules were an important part of the development of agricultural practices in our country. In addition, according to the American Mule Museum in Bishop, California, (www.mulemuseum.org) mules were also used to build roads, railways, telegraph and telephone lines, as well as most of our large dams and canals at the beginning of the 20th century.

The production of the American Jack came about to develop a hybrid animal that would fulfill the farmer's demand for a superior work animal to cultivate the soil for crop production. A mule is produced by crossing a mare horse with a male donkey.

The 1980 edition of *The History of American Jacks and Mules* states that the back of a card advertising Pioneer Seed Corn and Sorghum defined a mule this way:

"What is a mule? The mule's papa is a jackass. Its mamma is a mare. The papa's mamma is a jennet. The mamma's papa is a stallion. That makes the papa's mamma its paternal grandmother and the mamma's papa its paternal grandfather. The paternal grandmother may be the sister or the daughter or the mother of its papa while the maternal grandfather may be the brother or the son or the father of its mamma."

Well, that's clear as mud.

And to muddy the waters a bit more at this point, you cannot cross the other way to get a mule. A male horse crossed with a female donkey produces a much different specimen called a hinny.

During the heyday of mule use for farming, in an attempt to create a system of placing appropriate dollar value on a mule based on breeding and ancestry, the American Breeders Association of Jacks and Jennets was formed on September 17, 1888. Stockholders paid a sum of \$10.00 per share.

The History of American Jacks and Mules lays out the classifications and foundation for pedigrees to determine the quality of the breeding of these animals as was set forth by the Association. It contains minutes from meetings, lineage charts, and definitions of the various types of mules. These definitions include draft mules, sugar mules, cotton mules, mining mules, army



mules, and the plug.

I love John Wayne movies, and one of my favorite lines is, "Is that your plug?" from *McClintock*. I've often wondered what the definition of a plug was. Well, here it is. "Plugs are worn out, cheap mules that have little value. They usually are unsound in one or more respects, are very plain and rough in conformation, and may have considerable age. They are altogether too common to need further description."

At the Ag Museum, we have many mule drawn implements, wagons, buggies, and tools on display. There are many photographs of these magnificent animals at work in the logging fields, farm grounds, and just about any means of labor they were used for in Mississippi. The mule helped to bring Mississippi to its peak of cotton production in 1860.

The book I have referenced in this article is very interesting and entertaining and may be viewed in the library at the Ag Museum. Its author, Mr. Frank C. 'Jack' Mills did an excellent job at recording his recollections of the mule industry and the men who standardized the breeding

of the animals in this country.

We also have a nice pair of Belgian mules in residence at the Ag Museum named Joe and Sally. Staff and volunteers are working to provide wagon rides on the Museum grounds using Joe and Sally and to stage mule plowing demonstrations this spring. Watch for updates on our progress and the debut of the mule pulled wagon rides coming soon!

The Ag Museum is located at 1150 Lakeland Drive in Jackson and is open Tuesday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. In addition to our gallery and exhibit spaces, the Ag Museum also has room for your event, whether it's a meeting, a wedding, or other special event. 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

Advertising rules and guidelines have been established for the Mississippi Market Bulletin in order to comply with regulations enforced by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce and to maintain the objectives of the publication. The staff of the Mississippi Market Bulletin reserves the right to edit, revise or reject any advertisement.

The Mississippi Market Bulletin assumes no responsibility for any notice appearing in the Bulletin nor for any transaction resulting from published notices. 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
Farm to School Provides Marketing Opportunity for Mississippi Farmers

As spring approaches, farmers begin to focus on the crops that they will be planting soon. Prior to planting, it is a good practice to have a marketing plan in place detailing where products will be sold. Many fruit and vegetable growers choose to sell their crops through local farmers markets, retailers, wholesalers, and to restaurants. An additional market for fruits and vegetables is school systems. Selling to schools, often referred to as "farm to school," is gaining popularity across the country and in Mississippi. Efforts are being made to bring more locally-grown products into school lunchrooms.

Farm to school efforts benefit farmers, schools, and the local communities. The option to sell to schools creates an additional outlet for farmers to sell their produce while supplying schools with locally-grown produce, which tends to be fresher than produce that has traveled for miles over several days. Many schools that purchase from farmers take farm to school beyond the lunchroom and into the classroom by educating their students on where their food is coming from and the importance of farmers and agriculture. Local communities benefit from farm to school as money that is spent in the local economy tends to stay within the local economy.

There are two options available for farmers that are interested in selling their produce to schools. First, farmers can sell directly to their local school systems. When selling to local schools, farmers make contact with their local school system's Food Purchasing Director or Child Nutrition Director to discuss the products



that the school may be interested in purchasing. Farmers then work directly with the Director to discuss pricing, volume, and delivery.


The second option for farmers interested in getting their products into school lunchrooms is through participation in the statewide purchasing program administered by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC). Since 2002, MDE and MDAC have been working together to supply schools with produce from Mississippi farmers through the Department of Defense (DoD) Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program. Each year \$2.5 million is devoted to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables. The MDE and the MDAC strive to purchase as much as possible from Mississippi farmers. More than \$1.25 million worth of fruits and vegetables were purchased from Mississippi farmers over the past five years. Farmers participating in this program work directly with the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, rather than the school systems, to discuss product

availability and delivery.

Products that have been purchased from Mississippi growers through the DoD Farm to School program include: seedless watermelons, cantaloupes, frozen blueberries, sweet potatoes, satsumas, frozen collard greens, frozen butterbeans, frozen southern peas, bell peppers, grape tomatoes, eggplant, cucumbers, and strawberries. The MDE and MDAC are interested in expanding the volume and variety of Mississippi products and Mississippi farmers that participate in the program. Farmers that are interested in selling through the DoD Farm to School program should contact Chaille Clements with the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce at (601) 359-1140 or chaille@mdac.ms.gov.

Farmers participating in the statewide purchasing Farm to School program are required to obtain USDA's Good Agricultural Practices/Good Handling Practices (GAP/GHP) certification. To assist farmers in obtaining GAP/GHP certification, MDAC offers a cost-share program that covers 75 percent of the certification cost up to \$500. Farmers that are interested in participating in the GAP/GHP cost-share program should contact Michael Lasseter at (601) 359-1123 or michaelL@mdac.ms.gov.

As part of the Agency's effort to expand farm to school MDAC has developed a survey to determine some of the reasons why farmers may or may not sell to schools. It is designed to capture some of the challenges that farmers face when selling to schools. The information will be used when working with partner organizations to develop programs and materials that will make selling to schools simple for farmers. Raised Beds Make Gardening Easier

I don't know about you, but as I've gotten older, the thought of digging up an area of the yard to install a new planting bed has lost its appeal.

Between a bad back and bad knees -- not to mention bad elbows, shoulders and hands -- using a tiller to break up soil and adding lots of organic matter is just too much work. Along with the aches and pains, I hope age has made me a little wiser about work and relaxation in the garden and landscape.

My solution to new landscape beds is really an old idea: raised beds.

Mississippi gardeners will find that raised beds offer many advantages. They are easier on our backs and joints, but perhaps the greatest benefit of raised beds is the increased water drainage. Most landscape and garden plant problems I come across in Mississippi are related to poorly draining soil.

Growing plants and flowers in raised beds means the texture of the planting medium will remain loose and airy because it is not being walked upon. Raised beds also allow you to grow vegetables and other plants more densely than more traditional garden or landscape beds.

The construction parameters of raised beds are quite simple. The width of the bed should be no more than 4 feet. At this width, the longest reach is only 2 feet, which gives gardeners easy access to the bed from

either side.

Sides constructed from hardscape materials will keep the growing medium where it belongs. The choice of materials is up to the gardener, but I like the newer treated lumber.

If you use lumber, I suggest 2-by-6-inch, 2-by-8-inch or 2-by-10-inch boards, depending on how deep you want the beds to be. A deeper bed gives you more planting options.

Of course, cedar, fir and redwood have natural resistance to decay if you don't want to use treated lumber. These materials are more expensive but will last much longer than untreated pine. Other options include using block, recycled concrete or recycled plastic boards.

You could fill the raised bed with native soil because the height of the bed will greatly improve drainage. But I want you to change your garden paradigm a little bit and treat your new raised bed like a very large container.

I never recommend using only native soil in containers. I like to see a lot of organic matter worked into that soil. In fact, my raised beds are filled with commercial bagged container media with a high percentage of peat moss, vermiculite and perlite. This media remains light, fluffy and well-drained with excellent porosity.

How much growing media or soil will a new raised bed need? A quick formula is to multiply length by width by depth, all measured in feet. This equation works for any raised bed regardless of dimensions.

Whoever thought we would need to use math in the garden?
