Make Four Resolutions for Better Gardens in 2016

In my job with Mississippi State University, I am asked a lot of questions about problems people have with plants and ideas they have for their landscapes and gardens.

As we begin the new year, here is my list of four resolutions to help make your landscape and garden more enjoyable and productive in 2016.

1- Get those pesky landscape and lawn weeds under control.

Believe it or not, the middle of winter may be the perfect opportunity to do this. Applying pre-emergent herbicides is an easy way to control many annual weeds that will start to germinate in our landscape and lawn early this spring. Always read and follow the label instructions.

Several different compounds will do the job. If you want to stay organic, corn gluten meal is an effective alternative to synthetics. If you are planning on doing any direct seeding of the garden or lawn, pay particular attention to application timing. Pre-emergent herbicides will also block the germination and growth of plants you may be starting in the garden from seed.



2 - If you are not already a member, join your local garden club to learn what everyone is else is doing.

It's never too late to teach an old dog new tricks, especially in the garden and landscape. These clubs usually have guest speakers ranging from members with a particular expertise to local industry professionals. Gardeners are some of the most generous people you will ever meet.

Take the annual training and become a Master Gardener through the MSU Extension Service. You will get to know others with a mutual interest in learning, and you will meet many of MSU's specialists in entomology, plant pathology, weed and soil science, and horticulture.

The MSU Extension Service

also provides other opportunities across the state for increasing your horticultural knowledge. Contact your local county Extension office for more information on regional workshops and learning events.

3 - Keep a photo journal of your garden and landscape.

With digital photography, this is not a difficult task, and sharing your accomplishments gets easier every day. Online services allow you to upload pictures and share a link to them with your friends. Or you can take the plunge and post pictures to your Facebook account, letting the whole world enjoy your garden.

4 - Grow a new vegetable this year, something you think you

would not like in a million years.

One thing I've noticed about gardeners through the years – and this includes me – is that we all have certain ideas of what our vegetables should look like. Break that mold. I'm not saying you have to take a huge leap, but if you like zucchini, try a yellow zucchini like Butterstick or a round variety like Eightball. They have the same great zucchini taste but very different appearances.

Making any kind of New Year's resolution recognizes that we could be doing better. The landscape and garden is no different than any other area of our lives. Try these resolutions I've outlined or make some of your own for a better and more enjoyable landscape and garden in 2016.

From Our Kitchen To Yours

Black-Eyed Peas!



Southern tradition holds that the first food to be eaten on New Year's Day should be black-eyed peas for luck and prosperity—specifically one pea for each day of the year. To really ensure a good year, add a mess of greens for wealth.

**Lucky New Year's
Black-Eyed Pea Stew**

- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 cups finely shredded Napa cabbage
- 1 8-ounce can sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 1 pound ham hocks
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon Cajun seasoning
- Salt to taste
- 1 quart chicken stock
- 1 10-ounce package frozen black-eyed peas
- 1 1/2 cups basmati rice, well rinsed
- 3 cups water

Heat the oil in a deep pan or stockpot set over medium-high heat. Stir in the onions and garlic, and cook until transparent, about five minutes. Mix in the Napa cabbage; toss and cook until wilted, about two minutes. Add the ham hocks, cayenne pepper, bay leaf, Cajun seasoning, and salt, stirring for two minutes more. Pour in the chicken stock and black-eyed peas. Bring the mixture to a boil, and then reduce heat to low and cook uncovered for two hours. Meanwhile, place the rice and water into a saucepan. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer until all liquid is absorbed and rice is light and fluffy, about 20 minutes. Before serving, remove the ham hocks from the pot. Coarsely chop the meat, and return to the black-eyed pea mixture. Serve hot over basmati rice.

Slow Cooker Spicy Black-Eyed Peas

- 6 cups water
- 1 cube chicken bouillon
- 1 pound dried black-eyed peas, sorted & rinsed
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, diced
- 1 red bell pepper, stemmed, seeded, & diced
- 1 jalapeno chili, seeded & minced
- 8 ounces diced ham
- 4 slices bacon, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cumin
- Salt, to taste
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper

Pour the water into a slow cooker, add the bouillon cube, and stir to dissolve. Combine the black-eyed peas, onion, garlic, bell pepper, jalapeno pepper, ham, bacon, cayenne pepper, cumin, salt, and pepper; stir to blend. Cover the slow cooker and cook on low for 6 to 8 hours until the beans are tender.

Pico Black-Eyed Peas

- Pico de gallo:
- 3 tomatoes, diced
 - 1 small onion, chopped
 - 1 small jalapeno pepper, chopped
 - 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
 - 2 cloves garlic, minced
 - 1 lime, juiced, or more to taste
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 3 cups dry black-eyed peas
 - Water to cover

Mix tomatoes, onion, jalapeno pepper, cilantro, and garlic together in a bowl; add lime juice and salt and mix well. Refrigerate pico de gallo until flavors blend, at least 4 hours. Place black-eyed peas in a stockpot and pour in enough water to cover by one inch; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer until peas are tender, about one hour. Stir pico de gallo into peas.

Fried Black-Eyed Peas

- 1/2 pound bacon
- 3 cups canned black-eyed peas, rinsed & drained
- 2 tablespoons minced shallot
- 1/3 cup chopped roasted red peppers
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour, or as needed
- Salt and black pepper, to taste
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil

Place the bacon in a large, deep skillet, and cook over medium-high heat, turning occasionally, until evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain the bacon slices on a paper towel-lined plate. Mash the black-eyed peas in a bowl with a fork. Crumble the bacon into the peas, and stir in the shallot, red peppers, and enough flour to make the mixture stick together. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Form the black-eyed pea mixture into four patties. Melt the butter with the vegetable oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Cook the patties until golden brown and crispy on each side, about four minutes per side. Eat them as is or top with fried green tomatoes, candied yams or your favorite topping.



Sewing on a Button

As I was sitting by the fire one night sewing buttons on the dresses I just completed for my girls, the thought occurred to me that hand-made clothes are generally considered "custom" and maybe even "luxury items" these days. Skills like cast iron cooking, quilting, candle making, and special sewing techniques like tatting or weaving, are usually hobbies or practiced by specialty craftspeople today.

Less than one hundred years ago, these things were necessary knowledge. You had to "know how to do stuff" for mere survival.

The art of caring for your cast iron cookware was necessary because all of the cooking was done over an open fire or a wood burning stove. The skillet and Dutch oven had to be cared for because people did not have extra money to go buy a new one, and besides, those were meant to last a lifetime anyway.

Quilts were necessary to keep you warm at night because there was no central heat and air. Many were made from worn out clothes or left over scraps from making clothes. Today, we can go purchase or order our fabric, choose the colors very specifically, and get as much as we need for whatever our project may be at the moment. I have written about my Grandmother making shirts for my Papaw and my Daddy from feed sacks. They had to get three matching sacks to make a shirt. When the collars wore out on the shirts from too much wear, she turned the collar to get the rest the use out of the shirt. Then once the shirt was determined to be used up, she cut the buttons off to use again, and cut up the good fabric from the shirt to add to quilt making material.

This is also an example of how people once used what they had. There was no excess and what they had, they had made. Things were cared for and made to last.

Quilting, sewing and weaving were necessary skills. They were, and still are, forms of entertainment too. Ladies would sit by the fire in the evening working on projects like these. There were several reasons I can think of that this was done.

Outside work like splitting wood for the fire, feeding the livestock, mending the fences, building whatever needed to be built on the farm, tending the garden, washing the clothes, and so on, needed to be done during daylight hours. And, if the women were not involved in these things, they were likely cooking or cleaning up from the cooking, because like my Great Grandmother, they probably had nine children or more to feed. That took a lot of biscuit baking!

So, when the chores of the day were done, they could relax by the

light of the fire (or the candle they had made) and work on a sewing project. Since there was no TV to gather around, the family could talk or sing as Mom worked. Things like weaving are rhythmic and muscle memory takes over after a bit, so it could be done without watching the hands too much. And, yes, hand sewing is entertaining and relaxing; almost meditative.

My newly made sewing closet (claimed from a corner in the lawn-mower shed in our garage) is stocked with bolts of fabric and spools of thread enough to clothe my family for several years and plenty left over to make quilts for the beds. I am proud and thankful that my Momma taught me to sew on a button, that my Mamaw taught me to run a sewing machine, and for the ladies over the years who have taught me little tidbits about sewing. It is a very useful skill, and one I hope to teach my daughters.

Rebuilding efforts are underway, as well as continuing efforts toward the master plan renovations which began in 2013. 



Hardworking Beavers Play a Big Role in History

For an unassuming rodent, the beaver has quite a significant place in American history.

For more than 300 years, the beaver was one of the most valuable fur-bearing animals in North America and drove the fur trade, one of the earliest and most important industries in the development of the United States and Canada.

Beginning in the 16th century, French and English aristocrats began wearing top hats made from beaver pelts that had been matted into a silky felt. Beavers eventually became very scarce in Europe. Europeans, particularly the French, sent their countrymen to North America, where they set up trading posts and employed native people to hunt and trap beavers, along with other wildlife.

By the 19th century, a young United States was capitalizing on the fur trade venture and attracting businessmen from France, Britain, Spain and Russia. Many of these early traders settled in North America and contributed to the culture and political influence of the United States.

By the mid-1800s, the North American beaver had been trapped to near extinction, and silk hats became more popular than felt hats. During this time, wildlife enthusi-

asts began to notice the scarcity of beavers and lobbied to protect them from being trapped.

Over the past 75 years, beaver restocking efforts have helped restore populations to very healthy levels. In fact, increases in timber production, human populations and land development have created situations where beavers are now encroaching on private property, roads and agricultural fields. Many people regard them more as a nuisance than a benefit.

As aquatic mammals, beavers are unique in their industrious ability to construct and modify their own habitat. Some landowners view their presence as negative because their construction of a dam in a waterway can flood agricultural fields and forests. However, these ecosystem engineers create ponds that are ultimately beneficial to the overall ecology of an area, including wildlife populations.

Beaver ponds supply feeding and breeding areas for many species of amphibians, fish, waterfowl, reptile, bats, birds and insects. They provide essential edges and forest openings, create productive bottomland forests and supply moist-soil habitats for vegetation and wildlife.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates that beavers cause about \$100 million in damage to private property, roadways and agricultural businesses in the Southeast alone. They are particularly

problematic for the timber industry because their gnawing and flooding kills many high-grade hardwood trees. One beaver dam can flood thousands of acres of timber and agricultural crops. Floods can also damage homes or other structures.

Roadside ditches and culverts provide suitable living environments for beavers, but these habitats often result in flooded roads, damaged bridges and occasional car accidents. Finally, beavers can significantly damage ornamental shrubbery and vegetation, particularly when it is adjacent to beaver habitat.

Most wildlife managers aim for mutually beneficial coexistence with beaver populations. Although they can cause damage, beavers also provide many benefits to the ecosystem.

Mississippi landowners cannot control beavers on their property without a license or permit. Therefore, it is important to seek the assistance of trained wildlife professionals. The USDA Wildlife Services can provide limited assistance to landowners in mitigating beaver problems.

Trapping is probably the most effective tool for controlling nuisance beavers, followed by dam removal, sometimes aided by explosives or heavy equipment. Beaver removal can be an ongoing issue since the animals frequently return to familiar ponds and rebuild their sturdy homes, sometimes overnight.

New Year's Pasture Resolutions

A new year! Each January we make New Year's resolutions with the best of intentions. Of course, we all promise to eat better and exercise more, but have you ever given any thought to making resolutions about your pastures? Let's plan now to practice better pasture management this year. Assuming a good stand of introduced forage (such as bermudagrass), most of our management decisions for pasture forage production revolve around fertilizer, weed control and weather.

Most of us would like to spend the smallest amount of money on our pastures and get the greatest return on our investment. Therefore, let me tell you about a great, money saving secret for pasture fertilization: soil-test and fertilize your pastures according to the soil test recommendations. Rank your pastures according to productivity, and spend your fertilizer dollars on the highest yielding pastures first.

For those of you who apply a 17-17-17 or complete fertilizer each year without having a current soil test, you may be spending way too much. Why purchase nutrients if your soil is capable of supplying the necessary nutrients to the plants? MSU Extension Service soil tests cost \$6 per sample, not counting your time and effort.

As an example, if your soil analysis shows adequate potassium and you've been applying a complete fertilizer all these years, you will save money by not applying this nutrient.

That money can be spent on other projects around the ranch or farm.

One of the important parts of the soil test is your yield goal. If you provide a soils consultant with a realistic yield goal for your pastures, they can better determine how much fertilizer to recommend. You'll still need Mother Nature to help you out with timely rain and seasonable temperatures, but you will have done everything in your power to stack the odds in your favor. A word of advice on yield goals: If the pasture has never achieved the yield goal that you write down, you most likely will not achieve your goal no matter how much fertilizer or rain you receive.

Weed control in late January and early February is another often overlooked decision point. If you have a problem with thistles in your pastures, consider an application of about 1 quart per acre of 2,4-D amine formulation while the thistles are still in the rosette stage. When the thistles are in the rosette stage, they can be easily and inexpensively controlled with 2,4-D. The rosette stage is the vegetative stage of the thistle before it "bolts" or puts up a stem and seed head in the spring. Once the thistles start to bolt, it's all over.

Weather is the most consistently uncertain factor we have in agriculture. We can only say for certain that it will be cold in winter and hot during the summer. Regardless, you won't get the forage production you expect if you don't have the fertilizer on your pasture when the rain arrives.
