## Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce and Mississippi Department of Education to Celebrate Farm to School Week at StoneBridge Elementary School

The first full week of October marks Mississippi Farm to School Week. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce is collaborating with the Mississippi Department of Education to celebrate the third annual Mississippi Farm to School Week on Thursday, October 9, at StoneBridge Elementary School in Brandon, Mississippi. Students will have the opportunity to meet and dine with special guests including Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Cindy Hyde-Smith, House Agriculture Committee Chairman Preston Sullivan, Senate Agriculture Committee Vice-Chairman Russell Jolly, Brandon Mayor Butch Lee, Mississippi Department of Education Chief Operations Officer Todd Ivey, as well as Mississippi farmers participating in the Department of Defense (DoD) Farm to School Program who are responsible for growing some of the lunch menu items.

Through the DoD Farm to School Program, the Mississippi Department of Education and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce have made successful efforts over the past 12 years to increase the amount of Mississippi-grown fruits and vegetables served in lunchrooms across the State. This year alone, Mississippi schools ordered over \$1 million worth of locally grown fruits and vegetables.

The first full week of October was designated as Mississippi Farm to School Week by the Mississippi Legislature in 2012. Farm to School Week was introduced to encourage the serving of locally grown and locally raised agricultural products in school meals and to recognize the substantial economic and health benefits of farm to school programs. Farm to School Week will draw attention to the vast number of crops that are grown in the state as well as serve as an educational tool to teach children where their food comes from. Turn right onto Stonebridge Blvd. The front entrance to the School will be your second left at the StoneBridge Elementary sign. Veer right to reach the visitors' parking area. Follow the covered walkway to the main entrance of the building which will be the second door on your right. The office is to the left as you walk in the doors.
