

NOXIOUS WEEDS IN MISSISSIPPI

According to Section 136 of the Regulations Governing Plant Diseases, Insects and Weeds, the following weeds are considered noxious in Mississippi and subject to regulation:

1. Benghal dayflower (*Commelina benghalensis*) *
2. Brazilian Satintail (*Imperata braziliensis*) *
3. Chinese Tallow Tree/Popcorn Tree (*Sapium sebiferum*)
4. Cogongrass (*Imperata cylindrica*) *
5. Giant Salvinia (*Salvinia molesta*) *
6. Hydrilla (*Hydrilla verticillata*) *
7. Itchgrass (*Rottboellia cochinchinensis*) *
8. Kudzu (*Pueraria montana var. lobata*) *
9. Torpedograss (*Panicum repens*)
10. Tropical soda apple (*Solanum viarum*) *

NOXIOUS SEEDS IN MISSISSIPPI

According to Section 118 of the Pure Seed Regulations, the following is a list of noxious weeds and their maximum permitted rates of occurrence per pound of agricultural or vegetable seed.

<u>Name</u>	<u>Allowed Per Pound</u>
1. Crotalaria (<i>Crotalaria spp.</i>)	Prohibited
2. Field Bindweed (<i>Convolvulus arvensis</i>)	Prohibited
3. Hedge Bindweed (<i>Calystegia sepium</i>)	Prohibited
4. Nutgrass (<i>Cyperus rotundus and C. esculentus</i>)	Prohibited
5. Serrated Tussock (<i>Nassella trichotoma</i>)	Prohibited
6. Tropical Soda Apple (<i>Solanum viarum</i>)	Prohibited
7. Balloon Vine (<i>Caridospermum halicacabum</i>)	2

8. Bermudagrass (<i>Cynodon spp.</i>)	100
9. Blessed Thistle (<i>Cnicus benedictus</i>)	27
