To qualify for any permit examination; the applicant must be a bona fide employee of the license holder and have a valid Mississippi registered technician identification card. All permit examinations are given at Mississippi State University (Starkville, Mississippi) on the second Tuesday of January, April, July, and October. An application must be approved at least ten (10) days prior to the test date. (To allow application processing time, completed applications must be received two (2) weeks prior to exam date). AFTER YOUR APPLICATION HAS BEEN APPROVED YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF THE LOCATION AND DATE OF THE EXAMINATION. There are no fees for taking examinations, or for the issuance of a permit. Permit exams may be taken quarterly until passed.

#### HOW TO BECOME COMMERCIALLY CERTIFIED

The Mississippi State University Extension Service publishes self-study materials for those individuals who are seeking to become commercially certified. To prepare for taking the commercial certification exam, all applicants may purchase the general standards core manual, entitled Applying Pesticides Correctly. The manual, its price, and the order form may be found at <a href="https://techoutreach.msucares.com/commercial-pesticide-applicator-training-study-materials-order-form">https://techoutreach.msucares.com/commercial-pesticide-applicator-training-study-materials-order-form</a>. The manual is not available from the Bureau of Plant Industry. Permit applicants, who are not commercially certified, must pass the general standards core examination. Mississippi permit exams meet the standards of competency for specific commercial certification category exams as outlined in Environmental Protection Agency Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, § 171.4. Therefore, it is not necessary to take commercial certification category exams if permit exam is passed.

The applicant should study the general standards core manual and plan to take the exam at either the office of the Bureau of Plant Industry on any week day, except holidays, as long as the applicant notifies the Bureau 24 hours in advance at 662-325-3390 and receives approval, or at any of the six locations within the state where recertification sessions are conducted during the year. The general standards core exam may also be taken by permit applicants at the license and permit examination sessions on the second Tuesday of January, April, July, and October once approval is received.

The Bureau of Plant Industry, which is the regulatory agency in the State of Mississippi, conducts and administers all certification, license, and permit exams.
