Agriculture Fact Sheet Rice 2015



- Mississippi ranks #5 in the United States in rice production, producing 10,800,000 hundredweight of rice.
- In 2015, Mississippi had 259 rice farms.
- The value of rice production in Mississippi in 2015 was \$132 million.
- Rice is planted between April 1 and June 20 and is harvested between August 25 and October 27.
- Eighty percent of the rice grown in the United States is grown in the southern rice belt.

- U.S. rice growers grow an average of 5,600 pounds of rice per acre of production.
- Rice is a grain cereal, an important component to a healthy diet.
- Americans consume about 25 pounds of rice per year.
- In order to celebrate the harvest of rice, September is National Rice Month.
- Rice is low in fat while being a good source of vitamins and minerals.
- The word “rice” in Chinese means “agriculture” or “culture.”
- China is the largest producer of rice in the world. Thailand is the largest exporter.
- Rice was discovered in ancient China in 2800 B.C.
