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## State's Ag Producers Set Multiple Records In 2012

Significant production levels and high market prices combined to give Mississippi's agricultural commodities their second year in a row of over \$7 billion in total value.

Mississippi State University agricultural economists gathered preliminary data from crop production reports, world agricultural supply and demand estimates, industry resources and U.S. Department of Agriculture outlook reports. They predict a \$7.3 billion annual value of the state's top crops, excluding government payments. Final figures will be

available in the spring of 2013.

Their calculations held some surprises and a 9.4 percent increase over 2011. Poultry and eggs remained the top agricultural commodity at a predicted \$2.53 billion. Soybeans, with an estimated record value of \$1.16 billion, moved past forestry to claim the No. 2 spot in the state's rankings for the first time. No. 3 forestry saw a 7.7 percent increase and estimated value of \$1.03 billion.

"The fact that soybeans surpassed forestry is indicative of the year that we had," said John Michael Riley, agricultural economist with MSU's Extension Service. "The jump has everything to do with production and prices for soybeans, and the general economy as it relates to housing starts and the use of forest products. We saw a small growth in forestry value, but it wasn't enough to overcome the huge gain in soybeans."

In addition to its record value, Mississippi's soybean crop set records for average yield and total production in 2012. Mississippi fields averaged 42 bushels per acre, and the state produced 82.3 million bushels. Soybeans also benefited from record prices in 2012, averaging nearly \$14.55 per bushel, according to USDA estimates.

This year's corn crop came in at No. 4 with an estimated production value of \$891 million, the highest on record. As of mid-December, corn had the highest-ever yield per acre at 156 bushels. The number of bushels harvested -- 1.22 million -- is the highest since 2007, and the second highest in Mississippi's history.

Cotton moved down one spot to No. 5, with a decrease in production values of 43.9 percent in cotton lint and 19.6 percent in cottonseed.

"We're moving away from heavy cotton production and have been for five years or more," Riley said. "High corn prices and low cotton prices compounded the issue this year and

resulted in the drop to \$397 million predicted this year for cotton lint and cottonseed combined."

In the livestock sector, cattle and calves saw an increase of 38.7 percent, with an estimated production value of a record \$329 million, which pushed it up in the ranks to No. 6.

The state's catfish industry continues to feel the pinch of high feed costs and has an estimated 23.4 percent decrease from 2011. With an estimated value of \$165 million, catfish fell to No. 7.

Hay moved up one spot to No. 8 this year, in part because of drought conditions in Arkansas and Missouri, which caused a spike in sales. The value of hay produced in the state set a new record at \$145 million.

"The amount of hay produced increased due to favorable weather

conditions in many parts of the state," said Rocky Lemus, forages specialist with the MSU Extension Service and Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station. "We also saw an increase in the number of acres in hay production by about 30,000 acres compared to 2011."

Wheat moved up to rank ninth among the state's agricultural commodities, valued at \$134 million.

One of the most noticeable declines was in rice, which decreased 14.8 percent compared to 2011. It slipped from No. 8 to No. 10 in spite of the highest yield-per-acre average since 2007, at 7,100 pounds per acre.

"Rice growers in 2010 and 2011 were challenged with below-average yields and high input prices," said Nathan Buehring, rice specialist with MSU's Extension Service and

MAFES. "With corn and soybean prices at historical levels, traditional rice growers planted more corn and soybean. Mississippi was only estimated at 125,000 acres of rice this year -- the lowest acreage since 1977."

Hog producers saw a 7.6 percent decline this year, with the industry's production value estimated to be \$102 million. This keeps hogs ranked at No. 11, the same as 2011.

The No. 12 commodity is horticultural and specialty crops, including nursery and ornamental plants, valued at \$96 million, up 2 percent.

MSU Extension Service agricultural economist Ken Hood said the estimated value of the state's sweet potato crop is about \$79 million for 23,000 acres of sweet potatoes harvested in 2012, putting the crop at No. 13.


"This represents a 9.7 percent increase over the final value reported for the 2011," Hood said. "Mississippi is third in the nation in sweet potato production when comparing hundred-weight production per acre."

With a 192.6 percent increase in production value, peanuts jumped over milk and grain sorghum to take the No. 14 spot.

"Farmers are looking at opportunities," Riley said. "They saw that peanut prices were strong, and that led to an acreage response -- from 15,000 acres planted in 2011 to a record 52,000 acres planted in 2012. The jump in acres, along with decent prices, led to an estimated \$52 million in production value."

Milk and grain sorghum rounded out the annual rankings. No. 15 milk saw a decrease of 12.1 percent, with an estimated value of \$40 million. Grain sorghum increased 7.2 percent, with a predicted value of \$23 million for the 46,000 acres harvested.

### HAM & BEAN SOUP

1 cup dried navy beans  
1 meaty ham bone  
1 1/2 quarts water  
1 cup chopped celery  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
2 cans (14.5 ounces each) tomatoes  
1 teaspoon chopped dried parsley  
Or 1 tablespoon fresh chopped parsley  
Salt and pepper

Soak beans overnight in cold water; drain. Cover beans and ham bone with 1 1/2 quarts water. Add celery, onions, tomatoes and parsley. Cover and simmer 4 to 5 hours. About halfway through cooking time, when ham bone is very tender, remove ham from bone and cut into pieces; return to the soup. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

### SHRIMP STEW

1/2 cup chopped celery  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1 large clove garlic, minced  
1/4 cup butter  
1/3 cup all-purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme, crumbled  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1 can (14.5 ounces) diced tomatoes  
1 can (14 ounces) chicken broth or 2 cups homemade  
1 to 1 1/2 cups sliced cooked okra  
Few dashes hot pepper sauce  
1 can (8 ounces) minced clams, undrained  
1 pound medium shrimp, shelled and deveined  
3 cups cooked rice

In a skillet over medium heat, melt butter; sauté celery, onion, and garlic. Stir in flour, salt, thyme, and pepper. Continue cooking, stirring constantly, until bubbly. Stir in tomatoes, chicken broth, clams with liquid, and hot pepper sauce. Cook and stir until mixture thickens and bubbles, about 3 minutes. Add okra and shrimp; bring to the boiling point. In the center of individual serving bowls, make a mound of hot cooked rice. Ladle shrimp mixture around rice.

### CHEESEBURGER CHOWDER

1 pound lean ground beef  
2 medium potatoes, peeled and cubed, about 2 cups  
1/2 cup chopped celery  
1/4 cup chopped onion  
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper  
1 tablespoon beef bouillon granules or beef base  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 1/2 cups water  
2 1/2 cups milk  
3 tablespoon flour  
1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese

In a 3 to 4-quart saucepan, brown beef; drain off excess fat. Stir in cubed potatoes, chopped celery, chopped onion, chopped green pepper, bouillon or base, salt and water. Cover and bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer until vegetables are tender, about 15 to 20 minutes. Blend flour with 1/2 cup milk. Add to saucepan along with the remaining 2 cups milk. Cook and stir until thick and bubbly. Add cheese; heat and stir until cheese is melted.

### BLACK-EYED PEAS & GREENS SOUP

1 tablespoon vegetable oil  
1 cup diced onion  
1 cup diced celery  
1/2 cup diced sweet bell pepper, red or green  
4 to 6 ounces diced ham  
4 cloves garlic, minced  
4 cups chicken broth  
3 cups cooked black-eyed peas or 2 cans drained and rinsed  
1 1/2 cups frozen chopped turnip greens or spinach, thawed  
2 cans (14.5 ounces each) diced tomatoes, with juice  
1/2 teaspoon Creole seasoning  
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper  
1/4 teaspoon dried oregano  
Salt, to taste

In a large Dutch oven or large saucepan over medium heat, sauté the onion and celery in vegetable oil until tender. Add the ham, bell pepper, and garlic, and sauté, stirring, for 2 to 3 minutes longer. To the ham and vegetable mixture add chicken broth, black-eyed peas, greens, tomatoes, Creole seasoning, pepper, and oregano. Reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Taste and add salt, as needed.

### WINTER CHICKEN CHILI STEW

1 tablespoon olive oil  
2 cups chopped onion  
4 large garlic cloves, minced  
1 pound skinless boneless chicken breasts, washed and cubed  
1 large jalapeno pepper, seeded, finely chopped  
1 teaspoon ground coriander  
2 teaspoons ground cumin  
2 cans (14.5 ounces each) diced tomatoes in juice  
2 cans Great Northern beans, drained and rinsed well  
Juice of 1 lime  
2 cups frozen corn kernels, thawed, or fresh  
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste  
1/2 cup sour cream  
1/4 cup finely chopped red onion  
2 tablespoons chopped cilantro

Heat olive oil in a large nonstick saucepan over medium-high heat. Once oil is very hot, add onion and garlic; sauté until onions begins to brown. Add cubed chicken and brown on all sides; add chopped jalapeno, coriander, cumin, tomatoes and beans. Reduce heat and simmer for about 5 minutes; add lime juice, and stir in the corn kernels. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Continue cooking, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes or longer; serve with sour cream, chopped red onion, and chopped cilantro.







## Poultry Holds On To No. 1 Spot In State

Poultry again took the top spot among Mississippi's agricultural commodities for 2012, with a preliminary estimated value of \$2.5 billion.

The total estimated value of poultry increased from 2011 by 6.2 percent. Broilers gained 7 percent in value, while eggs and chickens stayed level with 2011's values.

John Michael Riley, agricultural economist with Mississippi State University's Extension Service, said poultry values for 2012 are higher than 2011 values and have increased every year for the past five years.

"Broiler prices in Mississippi have continued to trend up, with a 9 percent increase over 2011," Riley said. "Stronger prices compared to 2011 are the primary reason for the higher broiler value, given that pounds produced were down by about 2 percent."

The commodity's stability is due to its popularity among consumers.

"Poultry has long been considered a value protein compared to beef and pork, and it thrived during the



height of the recession," Riley said. "But with the uptick in the economy, beef prices decreased, and poultry took a bit of a hit as a result."

Estimated values of eggs and chickens dropped only slightly, and did not seriously impact the total commodity value.

"Even with the stalled economy, chicken products remain a very competitive protein option for the consumer," said Tom Tabler, Extension professor in the Department of Poultry Science at MSU. "In addition, historically high feed prices have kept a lid on production, and there is not an oversupply of poultry on the market."

The industry remains sturdy de-

spite high corn and soybean prices -- primary feed ingredients -- coupled with low market prices.

"The drought caused the price of feed to rise, and demand for poultry has not been as strong as in past years," Tabler said. "The consumer is very cost-conscious at the grocery store, and product loyalty, whether it's to poultry, beef or pork, may take a backseat to the best bargain. So we will likely see the poultry industry try to prop the price up a bit until export prices and demand improves and domestic demand increases."

Nationally, Mississippi ranks fifth behind Georgia, Arkansas, Alabama, and North Carolina in overall poultry production.

In 2012, Mississippi producers placed approximately 780 million chicks and produced nearly 1.4 billion table eggs.

A decrease in feed costs could lift the poultry industry's confidence in 2013.

"If the drought breaks and grain prices go down, we might see a cautious expansion of production," Tabler said. "But if grain prices remain high, the industry will be reluctant to increase production."

## Record Yields, Prices Push Soybeans To No. 2

A new record average yield of 42 bushels per acre pushed soybeans to a record value of more than \$1 billion, boosting the crop to No. 2 among Mississippi's agricultural commodities.

Soybeans have an estimated 2012 value of \$1.16 billion, up 37 percent from \$842 million in 2011. Soybeans came in behind poultry but for the first time were ahead of forestry in the ranking of the state's top three crops.

Trent Irby, soybean specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said high yields and high prices combined to create this historic mark.

"Soybeans have been an important crop in Mississippi for a number of years," Irby said. "In recent years, favorable market prices, as well as higher yields that many producers realized, have made soybeans a popular choice for our growers."

Mississippi growers harvested an estimated 2 million acres of soybeans in 2012, which is an increase from 2011 acreage but still in line with recent averages. This figure puts Mississippi No. 12 nationally in soybean acreage.

"Favorable market prices as well



as timely rains and light pest pressure across many areas helped make this a good year for soybeans," Irby said.

Brian Williams, Extension agricultural economist, said soybeans began the year at \$11.98 a bushel and slowly rose through spring to \$14.70 a bushel in May. After slumping briefly, prices rose to a July 20 high of \$17.90 a bushel.

"Soybean prices remained above \$16 a bushel until late September as news of a better-than-expected harvest began to flow in," Williams said. "Prices have been somewhat volatile in the fall but have mostly stayed within the \$14 to \$16 range."

These high prices contributed to another record for soybeans. The U.S. Department of Agriculture esti-

mates the market year average price for the crop is \$14.55 per bushel, up from the previous record of \$12 per bushel set in 2011.

Low soybean stocks and the drought in the Midwest drove soybean prices up over the summer, but better-than-expected nationwide yields led to a decrease in price.

"Right now, two of the biggest drivers of corn and soybean prices are outside the United States," Williams said. "Commodity traders are closely watching the South American crop. Planting is under way in Argentina and Brazil, and their crop conditions will play a major role in where we find crop prices throughout the winter."

"We are also watching the European economic situation and its impact on the strength of the U.S. dollar," he said. "The stronger the dollar, the more expensive our exports will be, which will drive down prices."

Looking ahead to 2013, Irby said spring weather, commodity prices and input costs will be key factors in the decisions on how many soybean acres are planted in the spring. Early indications are that soybeans will remain a strong crop option in 2013.

## Timber Value Jumps, Still Drops to No. 3

An 8 percent increase in a billion-dollar industry is significant, but timber still fell from its long-held second place spot on Mississippi's agricultural commodity list.

James Henderson, assistant forestry professor with Mississippi State University's Extension Service, is estimating the 2012 value of Mississippi forest products to be \$1.03 billion, compared with \$957 million the previous year. Final numbers using more complete data will replace the estimate in February.

Forestry has been in one of the state's top two commodities for a quarter of a century, spending the last 16 years behind poultry and eggs. In 2012, MSU economists predict soybeans will leap into second, pushing forestry to the No. 3 position.

Henderson said forestry and forest products sectors will remain a driving force in the state's economy.

"Processing harvested timber into products, such as lumber, paper and wood furniture, results in an economic impact to the state, amounting to more than \$10 billion in sales and contributing to more than 63,000 jobs," he said.

"The primary factors contributing to the 2012 harvest value's predicted increase are continued improvement in the national economy and residential construction," he said. "Pine sawtimber and hardwood pulpwood prices increased 2.5 percent and 17.2 percent, respectively. Both of these products were at historically low levels during 2011, and modest increases in demand for housing and pulp products resulted in modest improvement in demand and prices."

Henderson said the housing market continues to show improvement. Evidences of this change are increases in home sales and residential construction, and low inventories of new and existing homes.

"New home construction is expected to maintain a positive trend over the next several years, and demand for sawtimber should continue to show increases during 2013 as lumber mills increase production," he said. "However, stumpage prices will not necessarily increase greatly over the next several years as timber inventories in Mississippi are high." Estimates from the Mississippi Institute for Forest Inventory indicate increases in standing pine sawtimber of more than 43 percent since the beginning of the U.S. housing bubble collapse.

"It will take several years to reduce this inventory," Henderson said.

Other product categories, such as pine pulpwood and hardwood sawtimber, showed price declines



ranging from 2 percent to nearly 8 percent, reflecting relatively higher prices during 2011 with little improvement in demand during 2012.

"On the supply side, most mills were able to accrue substantial inventories earlier in the year because of the relatively dry spring and summer. Thus, demand from forest product mills began to wane, particularly for sawtimber products," he said.

Henderson expressed his belief that the U.S. housing market is on the path to recovery.

"Housing starts and permits -- leading indicators of construction -- are up by 42 percent from this time last year," he said. "Both new and existing home inventories are at lows not seen since the peak of the U.S. housing bubble. These are all positive indicators that demand for timber will be expanding over the next few years."

David Jones, assistant forest products professor with MSU's Extension Service, said when housing starts increase, all products made with wood increase in demand, including lumber, furniture and paper. While some export markets have declined, such as Greece and Italy, others have increased along with domestic demand, such as South Korea and Japan.

"Most people don't realize that natural disasters boost production and demand for forest products," Jones said. "Japan's tsunami recovery really kicked in this year, plus Hurricane Sandy hit the Northeast. Even bad winters can boost pole and piling manufacturing. Telephone poles have to be replaced when they are snapped by ice storms."

Jones said Hurricane Sandy will help the industry finish the last quarter of the year strong.

"Usually this time of year, mills have a low inventory. When you combine that with a natural disaster, prices pick up. 2013 should continue strong if current projections hold, and it should be a good year for forestry and forest products," he said.

According to the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce website, the state has 19.6 million forested acres owned by 125,000 landowners.
