Weather May Stall Summer Forage Crops

Hay producers need warmer temperatures and drier ground to catch up with production this spring.

"Everything is shaping up to be late with all the wet, cool weather we've had," said Charlie Bush, Mississippi State University Extension Service agent in Simpson County. Simpson was one of the counties where some fields flooded after most areas in central Mississippi received between three and 10 inches of rain between April 5 and 7.

Bush said producers who experienced flooding from the recent rains could lose what is left of their winter ryegrass pastures.

"The flooding will set the ryegrass



back if it doesn't kill it," Bush said. "The extent of damage depends on how strong the water's current was and how long the ground stayed under water.

"There will be significant damage for the farmers along the river, but most of the fields stayed above the flood waters and will suffer just from the cool temperatures and excess rainfall," he said. "Many fields are still too wet to harvest what's left of the ryegrass or get any equipment in to prepare for warm-season forages."

The Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition Report by the U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated 42 percent of pastures were in good condition for the week ending April 13, but 65 percent of fields had surplus moisture.

Only 9 percent rated excellent, and 2 percent of fields fell into the very poor category.

Rocky Lemus, Extension forage systems specialist, said producers are in a transition period right now between winter ryegrass and summer forages.

"Not a lot of hay is produced this

time of year," Lemus said. "Producers who bale their ryegrass may miss the last cutting or two."

Heavy rainfall and cool temperatures could postpone the planting, growing, and harvesting of summer crops.

"The low temperatures in mid-April were around freezing in many parts of the state, and that could damage the bermudagrass and bahiagrass that is beginning to green up," Lemus said. "Depending on the amount of damage, this could delay harvest this summer by a few weeks."

Lemus said it is difficult to predict if producers will face pest or disease pressures for the warm-season crops.

Quality is a factor in determining hay prices, and recent flooding could affect prices locally, said John Michael Riley, Extension agricultural economist.

"Hay prices and quality are very local and can vary widely from one town or county to another," Riley said. "If flooding decreases production or reduces quality, prices for

better quality hay could be pushed higher. But this would likely be an issue only in areas that experienced flooding."

On December 1, Mississippi hay stocks were at 1.25 million tons. That number is down 8 percent from the previous year, but it is consistent with the 5-year average, Riley said.

Because of sufficient supply, hay

prices in Mississippi should remain well below the national average, which was \$186 per ton in 2013.

"Based on my assessment, prices are about \$50 to \$80 per ton, with most around \$60 per ton in Mississippi," Riley said. "The national average is much higher due to the significant drought that continues to impact U.S. producers."

2014 Mississippi Hay Contest



Hay and baleage samples will be evaluated in the following categories:

1. Warm-season Perennial Grass Hay (e.g. bermudagrass and bahiagrass).
2. Mixed, Annual Grass, or Other hay (e.g. clover/tall fescue, clover/annual ryegrass, millet, annual ryegrass, sorghum-sudangrass, sudangrass, crabgrass, tallfescue/bermudagrass, bermudagrass/bahiagrass/dallisgrass).
3. Grass Baleage (high moisture grass forage ensiled in wrapped bales).

Hay entries will be judged using NIR testing procedures by the MSU Forage Quality Lab. The entries will be ranked using the Relative Forage Quality (RFQ) evaluation system, which accounts for protein, energy, and fiber digestibility.

Lab analysis samples must be taken from a single lot of hay and from a minimum of 5-10 randomly sampled square or round bales (total of 20 cores). Forage samples for analysis and contest entry (display) must be collected using a hay probe.

To qualify for entry to the 2014 Mississippi Hay Contest, the producer and submitting Extension Agent must complete the Contest Entry Form. The form along with the hay sample and a \$15.00 check made payable to MSU Forage Program, must be submitted simultaneously to:

Overnight Honey-Almond Multigrain Cereal

1/3 cup steel-cut oats
2 tablespoons uncooked pearl barley
1 1/4 cups water
1/8 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1 tablespoon sliced almonds, toasted
1 tablespoon honey

Combine oats, barley, and water in microwave-safe 4-cup bowl. Cover and refrigerated 4 hours or overnight. Uncover bowl, and stir in salt. Microwave, uncovered, at HIGH for 6 minutes or until most of liquid is absorbed, stirring well after 3 minutes. Stir in 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon and nutmeg. Top with almonds and honey.

Fontina and Parmesan Mushroom Bread Pudding

6 cups (1-inch) cubed sturdy 100% whole wheat bread (about 12 ounces)
Cooking spray
1 teaspoon olive oil
1/3 cup chopped shallots
2 8-ounce packages pre-sliced cremini mushrooms
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1 cup (4 ounces) shredded fontina cheese
2 tablespoons grated fresh Parmesan cheese
1 1/2 cups 1% low-fat milk
1/2 cup fat-free, less sodium chicken broth
3 large eggs, lightly beaten

Preheat oven to 350°. Place bread cubes on a jelly-roll pan; coat with cooking spray. Bake at 350° for 20 minutes or until lightly toasted, turning twice. Remove from oven; cool. Heat oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add shallots and mushrooms; sauté 12 minutes or until lightly browned and moisture evaporates. Remove from heat; stir in parsley, thyme, salt, and pepper. Place half of bread cubes in bottom of an 11x7-inch baking dish coated with cooking spray. Arrange mushroom mixture evenly over bread cubes in bottom of baking dish coated with cooking spray. Arrange mushroom mixture evenly over bread cubes; sprinkle with 1/2 cup fontina and 1 tablespoon Parmesan. Top with remaining bread cubes. Combine milk, broth, and eggs, stirring with a whisk. Pour over bread mixture. Gently press with back of a spoon; let stand 30 minutes. Top with remaining 1/2 cup fontina and remaining 1 tablespoon Parmesan. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes or until set. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving. Cut into 6 squares.

Herbed Bread-Stuffed Tomatoes

6 ripe firm plum tomatoes, cut in half lengthwise
1/2 teaspoon kosher salt, divided
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
4 ounces whole wheat bread (about 2 slices), toasted & cut into 1/2-inch cubes
1 tablespoon minced fresh basil
1 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
1 teaspoon minced fresh oregano
1/2 teaspoon minced fresh thyme
1 teaspoon minced garlic
2 tablespoons grated fresh Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 375°. Scoop pulp and seed from tomato halves into a sieve over a bowl; press with a spoon. Reserve 1/4 cup liquid in bowl. Discard pulp mixture. Place tomato halves, cut sides up, in an 11x7-inch baking dish. Sprinkle with 1/4 teaspoon salt and pepper. Place bread in a bowl; drizzle with tomato liquid. Stir in remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt, basil, oil, oregano, thyme, and garlic. Fill tomato halves with bread stuffing, pressing gently. Sprinkle each with 1/2 teaspoon cheese. Bake at 375° for 12 minutes or until thoroughly heated.

Whole Wheat Pasta with Sausage, Leeks, and Fontina

6 quarts water
2 1/2 teaspoons salt, divided
1 pound uncooked whole wheat penne or rigatoni
1 tablespoon olive oil
1 4-ounce link sweet Italian sausage
2 cups chopped leeks
4 cups shredded Savoy cabbage
1 cup fat-free, less-sodium chicken broth
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1/2 cup (2 ounces) shredded fontina cheese

Bring water and 2 teaspoons salt to a boil in a large stockpot. Stir in pasta; partially cover, and return to a boil, stirring frequently. Cook 8 minutes or until pasta is almost al dente, stirring occasionally; drain. While pasta cooks, heat olive oil in a Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Remove casing from the sausage. Add sausage to Dutch oven; cook 2 minutes or until lightly browned, stirring to crumble. Add leeks; cook 2 minutes or until leeks are soft, stirring frequently. Add cabbage; cook 2 minutes or until cabbage wilts, stirring frequently. Add remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt, broth, and pepper; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer 15 minutes or until vegetables are very tender. Add pasta to Dutch oven, tossing well to coat; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and cook 1 minute, stirring constantly, or until pasta is al dente. Remove from heat; stir in cheese. Serve immediately.



SBA Offers Disaster Assistance to Southwest Mississippi Residents Affected by Severe Weather and Flooding March 28-29

Mississippi residents and businesses affected by severe weather and flooding in the southwest part of the state that occurred on March 28-29 can apply for low-interest disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), announced by SBA Administrator Maria Contreras-Sweet.

Administrator Contreras-Sweet made the loans available in response to a letter from Governor Phil Bryant on April 8, requesting a disaster declaration by the SBA. The declaration covers Wilkinson County, and the adjacent counties of Adams, Amite, and Franklin in Mississippi; and Concordia, East Feliciana and West Feliciana parishes in Louisiana.

"The SBA is strongly committed to providing the people of Mississippi with the most effective and customer-focused response possible to assist homeowners, renters, and businesses of all sizes with federal disaster loans," said Administrator Contreras-Sweet. "Getting businesses and communities up and running after a disaster is our highest priority at SBA."

"Loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate. Homeowners and renters are eligible for loans up to \$40,000 to repair or replace damaged or destroyed personal property," said Frank Skaggs, director of SBA's Field Operations Center East in Atlanta,

Georgia. SBA's customer service representatives are available at the Disaster Loan Outreach Center to answer questions about the disaster loan program and help individuals complete their applications.

"Businesses and non-profit organizations of any size may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets," said SBA Mississippi District Director Janita Stewart.

Applicants may be eligible for a loan amount increase up to 20 percent of their physical damages, as verified by the SBA, to make improvements that help prevent the risk of future property damage caused by a similar disaster.

For small businesses, small agri-

cultural cooperatives, small aquaculture businesses and most private non-profit organizations of all sizes, the SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any physical property damage.

Interest rates are as low as 2.250 percent for homeowners and renters, 2.625 percent for non-profit organizations and 4 percent for businesses with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

Individuals and businesses unable to visit the center may also obtain information and loan applications by calling the SBA's Customer Service Center at 1-800-659-2955 (1-800-877-8339 for the deaf and hard-of-hearing), or by emailing disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. Loan applications can also be downloaded at www.sba.gov/disaster. Completed applications should be returned to the center or mailed to: U.S. Small Business Administration, Processing and Disbursement Center, 14925 Kingsport Road, Fort Worth, Texas 76155.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage is June 13, 2014. The deadline to return economic injury applications is January 14, 2015.

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A Roll in the Hay

Hay season is part of summer to me. I love the smell of it and watching the process. On our farm, as you grew up, you moved up in the 'pecking order' from truck driver to running the rake or the mower. As the only daughter and baby sister, I never moved past the rake, while my older brother has now graduated to the baler.

Hay was originally cut by teams of workers using a scythe, dried in the field, and gathered loose on wagons. Later, haying was done by horse-drawn implements like mowers. After the hay was cut and had dried, it was raked or rowed up by raking it into a linear heap by hand or with a horse-drawn implement. Turning hay, when needed, was done originally by hand with a fork or rake. The Ag Museum collection includes a hay fork dating in the 1860's and a rake of this vintage on display in the Heritage Center Gallery. Once the dried hay was rowed up, pitch forks were used to pile it loose onto a horse-drawn cart or wagon.

I'm not sure where the 'ground crew' falls in that pecking order I mentioned, but the throwing and stacking is hard work! That task was usually left to the teenage boys in our operation. But, I can remember my Papaw teaching my brothers how to stack them on the back of the pickup. He was a master. You could have driven down the interstate and never lost a bale.

With the invention of agricultural machinery like the tractor and the baler, most hay production became mecha-

nized by the 1930s. Early balers were designed to make bales that weighed around 100 pounds. Modern equipment can produce bales weighing up to 3,000 pounds! Obviously, there is no picking these up and pitching them on a trailer using muscle power.

One of the important stories to be told at the Ag Museum is the progression of improvements and invention made over time that has reduced the need for labor and allows farmers to produce larger quantities from less acreage. Mississippi harvested 720,000 acres of hay last year producing over two million tons. It represents the eighth largest agricultural commodity for our state. This is made possible through mechanized harvesting, weed management, and proper care of the soil.

On occasion, when my brothers are unavailable for farm labor, I still get to run the rake.

Even though I was told I was doing it backwards once by a friend, my Daddy didn't care. Help is help sometimes when the hay is cut and the summer thunder clouds loom over the field.

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State Soybean Value Grew \$1B since 2006

Soybeans have been an important commodity in Mississippi for more than 50 years, but recent advances have pushed the crop's value above \$1 billion.

Mississippi soybeans had a value of \$267 million in 2006, \$1.27 billion in 2012, and \$1.17 billion in 2013. Prices have been high for the past several years, but state producers put more effort into management and increased yields to a record average of 45 bushels an acre in 2012 and 2013.

"Soybean prices have been favorable in recent years, and combined with better management to produce higher yields, the crop has become an even more significant contributor to agricultural value in the state," said Greg Bohach, vice president of the Mississippi State University Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine. "In the past decade, yields have steadily increased. The acreage devoted to soybeans has stayed fairly constant at about 2 million acres for the last six years."

In 1961, Mississippi soybean producers harvested 1 million acres for the first time. Their fields yielded 22.5 bushels per acre and the crop was valued at about \$60 million. Over the following decades, the crop gained ground and improved yields, due in part to MSU's research and Extension efforts.

In 2006, producers harvested 1.65 million acres of soybeans at an average yield of 26 bushels an acre. Just seven years later, soybean producers set a record average yield of 45 bushels an acre harvested from 1.99 million acres.

Brian Williams, Extension ag-

ricultural economist, said price, yield and acreage drove the increase.

"Since 2003, Mississippi producers have broken the soybean yield record three times and tied it a fourth time," Williams said. "Price has also increased significantly over the past 10 years. In 2001, soybean prices were under \$5 per bushel, and they are trading at over \$14 a bushel today."

Williams said soybean yields the last two years are almost 20 bushels an acre better than they were in 2006. While that was a particularly bad year for production, yields have consistently improved from the early 2000s.

"There is no doubt that Mississippi growers have improved their soybean production," he said.

Soybean is one of the least expensive crops to grow and in the past was planted on some of the less productive farmland with limited management. The MSU agricultural division began extensive efforts to improve soybean production in the state, and the results have been dramatic.

"Both MSU and the Agricultural Research Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture began substantial support of the soybean enterprise in the 1960s," Bohach said.

The MSU Extension Service and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station, known as MAFES, began investing significant resources into the crop at that time.

"Dr. Edgar Hartwig at Stoneville was developing new soybean varieties, such as Lee, Bragg, Lamar, Sharkey and Forrest. These proved extremely beneficial for the Southern soybean industry and helped

earn Dr. Hartwig a place in the Agricultural Research Service Hall of Fame," Bohach said.

MAFES began work on soybean varieties, fertility, and weed and insect control. In 1972, the Mississippi Legislature founded the Soybean Promotion Board, which has helped fund research and Extension activities that significantly contributed to increasing soybean yields.

The Extension Service, which is marking its centennial anniversary in May, continues its mission to deliver research-proven information to the people of the state.

"Extension and research activities such as the SMART program in the past and the PHAUCET irrigation tool have been major factors in helping our producers harvest a crop valued at more than \$1 billion for the first time ever in 2012 and again in 2013," Bohach said.

SMART stands for Soybean Management by the Application of Research Technology, while PHAUCET stands for the Pipe Hole and Universal Crown Evaluation Tool.

Danny Murphy, owner of Murphy Farms in Madison County and chairman of the executive committee of the American Soybean Association, said soybeans have become a competitive crop today.

"You have to go back 20 years or more to when Alan Blaine was the Extension soybean specialist and Larry Heatherly at Stoneville helped pioneer the early-production system we use now," Murphy said. "Their work elevated the soybean crop to where it was treated as important and not a stepchild as it may have been over its past history."

Mississippi Corn Faces Another Delayed Start

Spring rains are delaying the state's corn planting much as they did in 2013, but growers will not complain if the season ends with another record harvest like last year's.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated the crop was just 64 percent planted by April 20, putting it farther behind than it was at this time last year and well behind the five-year average of 87 percent planted. It takes five to 10 days after a rain before growers are able to resume planting in saturated soils, and frequent rains have kept most growers from planting as intended.

Erick Larson, corn specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said despite rain and cold weather, it's not too late to keep planting.

"Research at Mississippi State University shows that corn grown with irrigation can maintain its optimal yield potential even when planted past May 1," Larson said. "Just like with any other crop, the planting window doesn't really close. With modern hybrids and irrigation, we can sustain optimal yields later than previously thought, and the yield reduction associated with later plantings is much less than perceived."

Rain also has hindered weed control efforts in newly planted fields. Jason Bond, a Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station weed scientist at MSU's Delta Research and Extension Center in Stoneville, said wet weather delays burn-down herbicide applications for winter annual weeds, allowing them to continue growing.

"By the time the weather cooperates to allow a herbicide application, winter annual weeds are often too large to control with a single application," Bond said. "This either means fields will be planted into existing stands of partially controlled weeds or an additional burn-down herbicide treatment will be required. This extra treatment may not have been included in the farm budget."

One way to control summer annual weeds is to plant early when weather allows.

"Summer annual weeds do not emerge until the temperatures are warm. Ideally, corn is up and growing vigorously by the time summer weeds emerge," Bond said. "Growers miss this opportunity if planting is delayed."

The saturated soils also threaten corn already in the ground.

"Corn is most vulnerable to satu-

rated conditions when it has germinated but not emerged above the soil surface," Larson said. "Some of the later planted corn may have more issues than that planted in early March."

USDA reports that 42 percent of the planted corn had emerged by April 20, and this corn has faced some unseasonably low temperatures.

"Corn's growing point is underground until it gets about a foot tall, largely protecting it from freeze and other factors that may cause topical burn," Larson said. "The plant can readily withstand some burn damage as long as there is some green leaf left. Even if all the leaves are killed, the corn plant can generate new leaves if warm, dry weather promotes regrowth after a freeze."

This year, Mississippi growers expect to plant 580,000 acres of corn, down from the 860,000 planted in 2013. Brian Williams, Extension agricultural economist, said price is a big part of the planned decrease.

"Nearby corn futures are trading for around \$5.01 per bushel in late April," Williams said. "For comparison, nearby corn futures were trading for close to \$6.50 per bushel a year ago."

Williams said corn prices were up in recent years because of short supplies that resulted from higher demand and drought. Prices are down this year largely due to a record 2013 harvest that replenished corn supplies.

"Although we aren't expected to have as many acres this year, the harvest is still expected to be large as a result of improving yields," he said.
