

“Raising The Barn” Ag Museum Foundation and Southern AgCredit Host Fundraiser

As many of you know, November 13, 2014, will be a day that is always etched in our hearts. On that day, a devastating fire occurred at the Ag Museum and destroyed the Children's Barnyard, the Vet Infirmary, and the maintenance shop. The good news is that we have not allowed the fire to stop the museum's effort to teach the next generation about the importance of agriculture and the innovations our ancestors de-

veloped to feed, clothe, and house themselves. Rebuilding efforts are underway, as well as continuing efforts toward the master plan renovations which began in 2013.

On June 12, 2015, the public will have the opportunity to support the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum Foundation with rebuilding efforts and future improvements. The Ag Museum will be the host site for the Mississippi Ag & Forestry Expo, sponsored by Southern AgCredit. The Expo, which is free to the public, begins at 8:00 a.m. in the Forestry Building. Experts from Mississippi State University Extension Service and Delta Wildlife will discuss topics relating to landowners and producers including wild hog control, summer food plots, non-native species control, gardening, timber management, agritourism, and the farm bill. A tradeshow will also be part of the Expo. A farmers market featuring local produce will be held on Main Street in Small Town from 11:30 a.m. until 1:30 p.m. Live tractor demonstrations will be provided by Mississippi Ag, and farm safety demonstrations will be provided by the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation.

The events of the day will also include the first annual “Raising the Barn” outdoor benefit concert at 6:00 p.m. The concert will feature the popular Knoxville-based Americana band *The Black Lillies*. Local band *Southern Grass* will serve as the opening act. Tickets are \$10 when purchased in advance or \$15 at the gate. Tickets are only \$1.00 for children ages 12 and under. Tickets can be pur-

Grilled Eggplant Caprese Salad

1/3 cup plus 2 tablespoons olive oil, divided
1 clove garlic, minced
1 medium eggplant, peeled & sliced into discs
2 large fresh tomatoes, sliced
1 pound soft, fresh buffalo mozzarella, sliced into rounds
1 large bunch fresh basil, cut into ribbons (chiffonade)
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
1/2 teaspoon sea salt

In a small bowl, mix together 2 tablespoons of olive oil with minced garlic. Brush eggplant with the mixture. Grill it on both sides just until it begins to soften, about 10 minutes. Set eggplant aside. This can be done a day ahead and refrigerated, if needed. Alternatively, you can use your oven to broil the eggplant until golden, about 10 minutes. Arrange the tomatoes, cheese, basil and eggplant slices attractively on a platter. Whisk together remaining 1/3 cup oil and vinegar, and drizzle over salad just before serving. Sprinkle with salt.

Blueberry Chicken Salad Wraps

3 tablespoons plain Greek yogurt
2 tablespoons mayonnaise
1/4 cup celery, finely chopped
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 cups cooked chicken, diced
3/4 cup fresh blueberries
6 large lettuce leaves
6 whole-wheat tortillas

In a medium bowl, combine yogurt, mayonnaise, celery and salt. Gently stir in chicken and blueberries. To warm tortillas, place a damp paper towel on a microwave-safe plate and top it with a tortilla. Repeat to make a stack of paper towels and tortillas, topped with a damp paper towel. Microwave tortillas on high until hot, 30 to 60 seconds. Place warm tortillas on counter and top each with a lettuce leaf. Scoop about 1/2 cup chicken-blueberry salad onto each lettuce leaf. Roll up each tortilla and cut in half. Secure with toothpicks, if desired. Serve immediately or wrap tightly in foil and refrigerate.

Oven-Fried Okra

1 quart fresh okra, sliced 1/4 - 1/2 -inch thick
1 cup cornmeal
Butter-flavored nonstick cooking spray
Salt and pepper, to taste

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a large bowl, sprinkle okra with cornmeal, tossing to coat. Spread on a baking sheet that has been coated with nonstick spray. Lightly coat okra with nonstick spray, and season with salt and pepper. Bake for 45-50 minutes, stirring occasionally, until golden brown.

Strawberry Lemonade Ice Pops

1 cup water
1 cup sugar
3 cups fresh strawberries or other berries of your choice
1/2 cup fresh lemon juice
1/2 cup fresh herbs such as mint and/or rosemary, loosely packed, optional

In a medium saucepan, bring sugar and water to a boil, and then reduce to a simmer. Stir occasionally until slightly thickened (to the consistency of corn syrup), about 10 minutes. Set aside to cool. Place strawberries and lemon juice (and herbs, if using) in a blender or food processor. Puree until smooth. If using herbs, puree until they are very well chopped. Slowly pour in simple syrup until well combined. Pour mixture into ice pop molds, and freeze for about 8 hours.

Spicy Summer Salsa

3 cups tomatoes, chopped
1 1/2 cups onion, chopped
4 tablespoons cilantro
3 jalapeno peppers, chopped
4 teaspoons white vinegar
4 garlic cloves, minced
1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix all ingredients in a medium saucepan, and cook slowly over low heat until salsa reaches your preferred consistency, about 3 hours. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Squash Croquettes

2 cups yellow squash, finely chopped
1 cup onion, finely chopped
1 egg, beaten
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup plus 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
Vegetable oil

In a large bowl, combine squash, onion, egg, salt and pepper. Mix well. Stir in flour. In a skillet, heat 1/2 -inch oil over medium-high heat. Drop batter by tablespoonsful into oil. Cook about 3 minutes per side or until golden brown, turning once. Drain croquettes on paper towels.

Cost-Share Program Assists Fruit and Vegetable Growers

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) is currently accepting applications to provide financial assistance to Mississippi fruit and vegetable growers receiving Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP) certifications. Eligible farmers will receive reimbursement for 75 percent of the certification costs up to \$500.

GAP/GHP audits are voluntary food safety audits to help reduce the risk of fruit and vegetable contamination. Kevin Riggan, Director, Federal/State Inspection Service, with MDAC believes the GAP/GHP food safety audit program is beneficial to all farmers, "Buyers and end consumers of fruits and vegetables have become very conscientious of where their produce is coming from and the steps that are taken to ensure that it is grown and packed in a safe, clean environment. The GAP/GHP food safety audit program is beneficial to farmers and packers because it verifies that food safety is being practiced effectively."

In order for farmers to receive re-

imbursement, they must complete an application with proper documentation of costs incurred. Only audits completed by an approved USDA certifier will be eligible for reimbursement. A list of auditors is available at www.ams.usda.gov/gapghp. Funds are available on a first-come, first-serve basis until the funds are depleted. Funding for this program is provided through the USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.

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Misconceptions Hurt Odds of Beating Back Fire Ants

People have many misconceptions on how to eliminate fire ant mounds and prevent them from coming back, and these erroneous beliefs hinder efforts to keep the harmful pest from spreading.

One of the biggest mistakes is trying to use common household materials to manage fire ants, said Blake Layton, entomology specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. More often than not, these "folk remedies" are ineffective or environmentally harmful, and they can cost more than commercial bait and mound treatments designed specifically to control fire ants. Typical makeshift solutions include gasoline, grits and soda.

Pouring gas on a mound does kill ants, but it also kills the grass and is a waste of money, Layton said.

"Gasoline is not legal to use in this way because it is not safe or environmentally suitable, and thus is not labeled for this use," he said. "Also, it would be a very costly method of control."

Fire ants supposedly explode after eating grits. However, this remedy is a tall tale, Layton said. Some people believe that drenching a mound with club soda will smother ants with car-

bon dioxide, but this method is also inefficient.

"Fire ants like grits just fine and will not explode after eating them," he said. "It is possible to smother a mound with carbon dioxide, but it would take a good bit of effort. Some people will shovel mounds together so the ants will fight and kill each other. Ants from different mounds will usually fight, but this is not really an effective way to control fire ants -- far too labor intensive, even if it did work."

Many people also believe that mowing the lawn causes fire ants to vacate an area. Disturbing a mound with the lawn mower is a good way to upset ant colonies, but it doesn't do anything to get rid of them, Layton said.

"Ants build mounds high during spring time to get solar heating for the brood, and to stay out of water logged soils," he said. "If the ground gets dry during the summer, the ants move the brood deeper into the cool soil. If the area is mown, the mounds seem to disappear, but the colonies are still there."

Another common misconception is that fire ants simply crawl over from a neighbor's yard to invade a new area. Layton said the ants reproduce and spread by swarming.

"The males and females fly up into

the air, mate up there, and then the mated queens fall back to earth to start new colonies," he said. "During this mating flight, they may travel several hundred yards to several miles, depending on wind. It is these mated females raining back down that cause new fire ant colonies, though it takes about six months to a year for new colony to grow into a large mound."

According to Lowndes County Extension agent Reid Nevins Layton, the best approach to fire ant control is to use individual mound treatments in conjunction with broadcast applications of granular fire ant bait or broadcast treatments with residual insecticides to control all ants in an area. Nevins said two of the best times to broadcast are during the early spring and late summer.

"I get a lot of calls about fire ants," Nevins said. "I tell my clients that the best thing to do is broadcast bait across the whole yard at least twice a year. It will take several weeks before you can knock it down if you've got a widespread problem, but it works."

Layton suggested applying granular fire ant baits as broadcast treatments three or four times per year.

"This is the foundation of a good fire ant control program," Layton said. "Use individual mound treatments to control problem mounds

that escape the bait treatments.

These can be dry mound treatments with acephate or liquid mound drenches with products containing contact insecticides like permethrin

or carbaryl."

Armadillos Dig up Big Issues For Landowners

It can climb, dig, swim and run, but in spite of its physical skills, the nine-banded armadillo is frequently roadkill.

You might not have even known it is a member of the mammal class. It bears very little resemblance to any other mammal in that it is not covered in fur or hair. Instead, it has nine bony armor rings covering the area between its shoulder and hip. Its long tail has an additional 12 bony rings.

Armadillos also have distinct, narrow heads and flat, pig-like snouts used to assist in digging. These animals are almost exclusively insectivorous, meaning their prey consists of insects. Many homeowners can detect the presence of armadillos by the shallow holes and rooting they leave behind when digging for food.

Because armadillos are nocturnal, or active at night, they easily stay hidden. Signs of rooting are sometimes the only indication the animal is present. During the day, they stay

hidden in shallow, underground burrows around stumps, rock piles or dense woodlands.

One common place to see an armadillo, however, is usually dead on the side of the road. Armadillos have very poor eyesight, and, although they are agile runners, they often cannot see a car coming until it is too late. And unfortunately for them, their bony armor cannot withstand the impact of a vehicle.

Although the dense forests and loose, sandy soil of Mississippi are perfect habitats for the armadillo, this animal is not native to our state. Texas began to document armadillo presence along the Rio Grande Valley around 1849. By 1950, all of Louisiana, southern Oklahoma and Arkansas also had these armored mammals inhabiting their states. By 1970, armadillos were found throughout Mississippi.


Armadillo tracks are quite distinct, made by three long toes with sharp claws. Shallow holes and the appearance of "swirled" leaves, pine straw or soil are characteristic of armadillo rooting. Common places to see armadillo damage would be along driveways, on golf courses,

and in lawns, vegetable gardens, flower beds and wooded areas. Armadillos may uproot flowers and vegetables in search of insects, and they can even be quite loud as they rub their bony plates along trees, houses and other structures.

The most costly damage created by armadillos occurs when they burrow under driveways, fencing, and house or outbuilding foundations. Some poultry farmers also report egg losses to armadillos, because this food source is high in nutrients and energy.

Before selecting a management method for armadillos, homeowners should be aware of certain behaviors and hazards. First, armadillos are efficient climbers, diggers and swimmers, so fencing barriers are not always the best methods to deter these animals.

Also, homeowners should take extreme caution when handling these animals, whether removing them from a trap or moving a carcass. Armadillos can be infected with the bacterium that causes leprosy. Although the transmission of this disease from armadillos to humans is relatively unstudied, there is a po-

tential health risk.

When handling an armadillo, you should always wear gloves and protective clothing. Removing brush, rocks and dense cover in an area may discourage armadillos from burrowing and becoming established. Distributing soil or lawn insecticides will also remove the insect food source from an area and deter armadillos from digging or burrowing. However, in most cases, trapping or shooting may be the most effective and permanent methods for remov-

ing armadillos.

Live traps placed along pathways and baited with spoiled fruit or mealworms have been shown to be moderately successful. If you do opt for lethal removal, choose a time near dusk when armadillos begin activity, and always check your local firearm laws before shooting.

If armadillo damage persists, contact your local animal control for assistance. They can either help you directly or recommend an animal removal service.



Growers Find Perfect Fit with Farmers Markets

A profitable sales outlet and a ready-made customer base make farmers markets the ideal channels for small-scale producers to sell their crops.

"Price and demand both drive the success of farmers markets," said Rick Snyder, vegetable specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service and researcher with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station in Crystal Springs. "Growers are able to cut out the wholesale middleman and sell their fresh produce to the consumer at retail prices.

"Many customers today are locavores who make it a point to buy local, and the grower doesn't have to go looking for them. They will be there. They want fresher fruits and vegetables to feed their families. And nothing is fresher than produce grown right in your town or county," Snyder said.

In 2004, Mississippi had 23 known farmers markets. That number steadily increased to 84 by 2014.

More markets allow growers to sell in multiple towns and spread out their harvest days, Snyder said.

Leon Eaton, who owns Triple Eaton Farms in Mount Olive, uses this strategy. He grows tomatoes, bell peppers, eggplants and other vegetables hydroponically and sells them from his farm and at farmers markets throughout the southern half of the state, including Crystal Springs, Hattiesburg and Gulfport.

"I bought the farm in 2005 and wanted a way to make the farm a year-round, sustainable business," Eaton said. "I discovered tomatoes are a good seller, and that hydroponic was the best way to produce them."

Vegetables produced hydroponically are grown without soil in a greenhouse and fed nutrients through a computerized watering

system. This technique reduces the challenges posed by insects and diseases and extends the growing season for vine-ripened tomatoes.

During peak production in the summer, Eaton's operation yields 4,000 pounds of tomatoes per week. Although he plans to pursue selling his vegetables to commercial grocery stores, he intends to continue offering his products at farmers markets.

"I like the opportunity that farmers markets offer for networking with other producers and getting feedback from customers," Eaton said. "I also like providing products people want. Customers line up to buy our produce."

Eaton uses no chemical pesticides to produce his vegetables, which is a benefit highly valued by many customers.

The interest in naturally grown produce has increased demand for locally grown crops, said David Nagel, Extension horticulture specialist. Other factors influencing the rise in farmers markets include national health recalls of produce and a struggling economy with fewer jobs. Mississippi has benefited from a strong effort by the MSU Extension Service and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce to develop farmers markets and create a positive environment for growers and consumers.


Increased demand means there is plenty of room in the market for new growers.

"It takes many growers to sustain farmers markets, but interested individuals should do their research before growing for farmers markets," Nagel said. "Each location is unique, and some vegetables do well in some locations but not very well in others. New growers should understand the local market and decide what needs are not being met."
