October Marks 156 Years of Mississippi State Fair Tradition

Fall, football and the Mississippi State Fair; these are just a few of the many exciting endeavors October brings to Mississippi each year. Each of these endeavors comes steeped in tradition. One tradition that Mississippians have become quite familiar with is the Mississippi State Fair Biscuit Booth.

Since its inception, the Biscuit Booth has been a staple at the fair. Year after year, fairgoers flock to the comfort of warm biscuits dripping with sweet syrup. Last year alone, the booth passed out 104,450 biscuits that were hand-crafted by volunteers with a whopping 620 gallons

of buttermilk from Prairie Farms, 7,200 pounds of flour from Kroger, 700 pounds of shortening from the Fair Commission, and 90 cases of Blackburn Syrup.

As fairgoers return to the Biscuit Booth each year, it has become a time-honored, Mississippi tradition. A visit to the Mississippi State Fair would not truly be complete without a warm, homemade biscuit oozing with Blackburn's sweet sugarcane syrup.

Another tasty tradition the fair brings to Mississippi is "fair food". Each year, fairgoers anxiously await the innovative, and certainly non-dietetic, culinary creations. Food findings including fried Oreos, giant turkey legs, cookie-dough-on-a-stick and donut-bunned hamburgers can be discovered on the midway throughout the ten-day feasting festival also known as the Missis-

sippi State Fair. Fairgoers also look forward to enjoying local favorites at the fair including everything from Penn's Restaurant's catfish and chicken-on-a-stick to the Mississippi Cattlemen's Association Beef Barn's brisket sandwich and beef sundae.

The Mississippi State Fair has always been a promoter and supporter of wholesome, family fun. One tradition that drives families to the fair each year is the 4-H and FFA Livestock Show. Each year, youth from 4-H and FFA groups around the state arrive at the fair to exhibit in the junior livestock shows. Last year alone, the junior shows had over 1,400 animal entries. Champion winners walk away from competitions with a cash prize and a shiny gold trophy. Livestock shows continue to be a driving factor of the fair as families return year after year and generation after



generation to exhibit.

"Whether it's for the food, the rides, the 4-H and FFA shows, or the musical entertainment, fairgoers continue to return to the midway each and every October. Deep-rooted fair tradition coupled with new and exciting entertainment makes the Mississippi State Fair a treat for the whole family," said Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Cindy Hyde-Smith.

The gates to the 156th Mississippi State Fair will open as Commissioner Hyde-Smith cuts the ceremonial ribbon at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 7. With last year's attendance reaching over 700,000 people, a record-breaking crowd is expected again this year. The fair will be home to an impeccable lineup of entertainers including Blood Sweat & Tears, Bell Biv Devoe, The Highwaymen, Kraig Parker, Corey Smith, Theory of a Deadman, Shawn Mendes and Joe Nichols. Fairgoers will also find thrilling rides, spectacles from around the world, and a new attraction, the Great American Ag-Ventureland, which allows visitors a real

farm experience.

"All of us at the Mississippi Fair Commission are looking forward to seeing you at this year's fair, which is shaping up to be the best State Fair ever! First, you will see Ag-Ventureland, brought to us by the Great American Entertainment Company, followed closely by the newly renovated, immensely popular Biscuit Booth. Other new attractions, rides and food booths, along with your historically, traditional favorites, will highlight one of the largest midways in the United States," said Mississippi Fair Commission Executive Director Rick Reno.

Daily activities will take place in the TradeMart, the Kirk Fordice Equine Center, and all along the 100 acres of Mississippi Fairgrounds Complex. The Mississippi State Fair runs Wednesday, October 7 through Sunday, October 18, with a gate admission price of \$5.00 per person. Children under the age of 6 are admitted free of charge. Bacon-Wrapped Corn

8 large ears of corn, husks removed
8 bacon strips
2 tablespoons chili powder

Wrap each ear of corn with a bacon strip; place on a piece of heavy-duty foil. Sprinkle with chili powder. Wrap securely, twisting ends to make handles for turning. Grill corn, covered, over medium heat 20-25 minutes or until corn is tender and bacon is cooked, turning once.

Deep-Fried Candy Bars on a Stick

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
4 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 tablespoon sugar
1 tablespoon brown sugar
1/8 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 egg
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup 2% milk
1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
24 fun-size Snickers and/or Milky Way candy bars, frozen
Oil for deep-fat frying
Wooden skewers
Confectioners' sugar, optional

In a small bowl, combine the first six ingredients. In another bowl, whisk together the egg, water, milk and vanilla; add to dry ingredients just until moistened. Dip candy bars into batter. In an electric skillet or deep fryer, heat oil to 375°. Drop candy bars, a few at a time, into hot oil. Fry until golden brown, about 30 seconds on each side. Drain on paper towels. Insert skewers into bars; dust with confectioners' sugar if desired.

State Fair Subs

1 Loaf (1 pound unsliced) French bread
2 eggs
1/4 cup milk
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 pound bulk Italian sausage
1 1/2 cups chopped onion
2 cups (8 ounces) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

Cut bread in half lengthwise; carefully hollow out top and bottom of loaf, leaving a 1-inch shell. Cube the removed bread. In a large bowl, beat the eggs, milk, pepper and salt. Add bread cubes and toss to coat; set aside. In a skillet over medium heat, cook sausage and onion until the meat is no longer pink; drain. Add to the bread mixture. Spoon filling into bread shells; sprinkle with cheese, wrap each in foil. Bake bread at 400° for 20-25 minutes or until cheese is melted. Cut into serving-size slices.

County Fair Cherry Pie

1 1/4 cups sugar
2 tablespoons cornstarch
Dash salt
4 cups pitted tart cherries
Pastry for double-crust 9-inch pie
Star cookie cutters (1/2-inch & 2-inches)
Confectioners' sugar

In a large saucepan, combine sugar, cornstarch and salt; stir in cherries. Let stand 30 minutes. Cook and stir cherry mixture over medium heat until mixture boils and starts to thicken. Pour into jars or freezer containers, leaving 1/2-inch headspace. Cool. Cover with lids; refrigerate or freeze. Yield: 3 cups filling for one pie. To make pie: preheat oven to 375°. Line a 9-inch pie plate with bottom pastry; add filling (if filling is frozen, thaw in the refrigerator overnight). Flute edges of pastry. Bake 45 minutes or until crust is golden brown and filling is bubbly. Cover edges of crust with foil during the last 20 minutes to prevent overbrowning. Meanwhile, cut remaining pastry into 12-14 large stars and 16-18 small stars; place on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 375° 8-10 minutes or until golden brown. Remove to wire rack to cool. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Place stars randomly over cooled pie. Sprinkle edges of pie with confectioners' sugar.

Pizza on a Stick

8 ounces Italian turkey sausage links
2 cups whole fresh mushrooms
2 cups cherry tomatoes
1 medium onion, cut into 1-inch pieces
1 large green pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
30 slices turkey pepperoni (2 ounces)
1 tube (13.8 ounces) refrigerated pizza crust
1 1/2 cups (6 ounces) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
1 1/4 cups pizza sauce, warmed

Preheat oven to 400°. In a large nonstick skillet, cook sausage over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. When cool enough to handle, cut sausage into 20 pieces. On 10 metal or wooden skewers, alternately thread sausage, vegetables and pepperoni. Unroll pizza dough onto a lightly floured surface; cut widthwise into 1-inch-wide strips. Starting at the pointed end of a prepared skewer, pierce skewer through one end of dough strip. Spiral-wrap dough strip around skewer, allowing vegetables and meats to peek through. Wrap the remaining end of dough strip around skewer above the first ingredient. Repeat with remaining dough strips and prepared skewers. Arrange kabobs on a baking sheet coated with cooking spray. Bake 10-12 minutes or until vegetables are tender and pizza crust is golden. Immediately sprinkle with cheese. Serve with pizza sauce.







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It's Pumpkin Time!

When I was a teenager, my Daddy had a sweet way of telling me it was time to tell the boy on the porch goodnight. He would come to the door and say, "It's pumpkin time." The meaning was clear. Princesses turn into a pumpkin at certain time of night, right? Maybe really it was that Momma and Daddy were ready to go to bed.

It's Pumpkin Time at the Ag Museum! The 2015 Pumpkin Adventure starts the week of October 14-16 and continues October 21-24 and 28-31.

Here are a few interesting facts about Pumpkins.

1. The pumpkin is a member of the cucurbit family, which are gourds, such as cucumbers and squashes.

2. The original Greek name for the pumpkin was pepon, which meant large melon. The word was gradually changed by the French, English and the Americans into the word 'pumpkin.'

3. 'Pumpkin' first appeared in literature in the 17th century when the Cinderella fairy tale was written.

4. They come in many shapes, sizes and colors. There is even a variety called Cinderella.

5. The pumpkin is classified as a fruit.

6. Pumpkin seeds are traditionally planted in July for a fall crop.

7. The heaviest pumpkin on record was in October of 2012 – it weighed 2009 pounds!

8. Turnips or potatoes were originally carved at Halloween – not pumpkins. It was the Irish immigrants who created the jack-o'-lantern ritual.

9. While pumpkin pie is a traditional Thanksgiving dish, it can be used in many more recipes, such as lasagna, pasta and soups.

10. Pumpkins are believed to have originated in the Americas.

Early pumpkins in the United States were not the traditional round orange upright fruit we think of today. They were a crooked neck variety which stored well. Ar-

cheologists have determined that variations of squash and pumpkins were cultivated along river and creek banks along with sunflowers and beans. This took place long before the emergence of maize or corn. After maize was introduced, ancient farmers learned to grow squash with maize and beans using the "Three Sisters" tradition.

The Three Sisters are squash, corn and beans which grow and thrive together. The corn serves as the trellis for the beans. The bean roots set nitrogen in the soil to fertilize the corn. The bean vines help to stabilize the corn stalks on windy days. The squash plants shelter the shallow roots of the corn and shade the ground to discourage weeds and preserve moisture. The early Native American farmers were practicing an early form of sustainable agriculture.

These early Native Americans roasted pumpkin strips over campfires and used them as a food source, long before the arrival of European explorers. Pumpkins helped The Native Americans make it through long cold winters. They used the sweet flesh in numerous ways: roasted, baked, parched, boiled and dried. They ate the pumpkin seeds and also used them as a medicine. The blossoms were added to stews. Dried pumpkin could be stored and ground into flour. They dried the shells and used them as bowls and containers to store grain, beans and seeds.

Early American settlers found many uses for pumpkins including beer, a fermented combination of persimmons, hops, maple sugar and pumpkin. They learned to cut the top off of a pumpkin, scoop the seeds out, and fill them with cream, honey, eggs and spices. They buried it in the hot ashes of a cooking fire and scooped out the cooked contents like a custard. They were also used as a template for haircuts to get a round, even cut. Now there's a funny mental image!

Without pumpkins many of the early settlers might have died from starvation. The following poem is a evidence of the Pilgrims dependence upon pumpkins for food:





Home Gardening Fest Set For October 16 and 17

The Southeast's most popular home gardening event will open to home gardeners and horticultural professionals October 16 and 17 at the Mississippi State University Truck Crops Branch Experiment Station in Crystal Springs.

Each year, the Fall Flower & Garden Fest draws an average of 5,000 visitors interested in learning about all aspects of vegetable, flower and herb gardening.

Experts from the MSU Extension Service, the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station, Master Gardeners and other groups will deliver 17 educational garden seminars each day and give one-on-one advice on the latest gardening techniques and plant recommendations.

Admission and on-site parking are free. The event opens at 9 a.m. and closes at 2 p.m. both days. Vendors will offer food and drinks.

MSU specialists will give informational walking tours of the gardens throughout the event on topics specific to flowers, vegetables, landscape plants, diseases and insects. Among other topics are composting,

A 3-acre garden will display more than 70 vegetable and flower varieties that are All-America Selections winners, a prestigious national horticultural award. The All-America Selections logo will be displayed on the winning plants' variety signs.

More than 60 vendors will offer many kinds of plants, yard art and garden tools for sale. Attendees can ask gardening questions, get soil tested, and have plants, insects or disease samples identified at the Plant Doctor Table under the main tent.

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




The month of October marks Agritourism Month. It also coincides with my favorite time of the year. One of the things that I enjoy the most is visiting agritourism operations in the state. Visiting these farms certainly take me back to my childhood growing up on a farm. Although I no longer live on a farm, I want my child to experience a little bit of farm life, and most importantly, I want him to know where his food comes from and what it takes to get food from the farm to the table.

Mississippi has 68 registered agritourism operations. These farms include row crop farms, fruit and vegetable farms, dairy farms, alpaca farms, Christmas tree farms, goat farms, ranches and even demonstration farms. The activities offered at each farm are diverse and include attractions such as u-picks, petting zoos, pumpkin patches, hayrides, corn mazes, train rides, farmers markets, hay mazes, tours, horseback riding, educational activities, demonstrations, music, festivals and much more.

As you are preparing to visit some of our state's outstanding farms, you may want to keep a few things in mind to ensure that you make the most of your visit and create fun memories that will last a lifetime.

1. Dress Comfortable. Remember that you will be on a working farm so comfortable shoes and dress are a must. You will probably be doing some walking. Many operations offer hay rides around the farm so you may be climbing on and off a trailer. If you will be visiting during the day, you may want to bring along sunscreen and a hat. For late afternoon or night activities, you may want to

have mosquito repellent handy.

2. Bring extra money. The cost of admission varies for each farm. It is always good to bring extra money with you in addition to the admission fee. Many farms have a store where you can purchase a variety of goodies ranging from jams and jellies made on the farm to t-shirts, toys and other souvenirs. Some farms even offer snacks and meals in case you get hungry.

3. Allow yourself plenty of time to visit the entire farm. Just as you would when visiting any other attractions, allow ample time to explore the entire farm. You can find lots of different activities at the various agritourism operations across the state. Pumpkin patches, u-picks, corn mazes, pony and train rides, playgrounds, and educational activities are just a few of the activities that you will find on these farms. Depending on the number of visitors, you may have a small wait to partici-

pate in some of these activities.

4. Come prepared to the farm. Do some research ahead of time by calling the farm or visiting the farm's website or social media pages to discover more about the farm's offerings and to inquire if there is anything extra that you may want to bring to enhance your experience. For instance, if you are visiting a u-pick farm, you may want to inquire if you need to bring your own baskets or buckets for the produce that you pick or if they will be made available to you. Some farms may offer some great picnic spots for those that enjoy outdoor picnicking. By knowing this ahead of time, you will know whether to pack your picnic basket and blanket.

5. Check out MDAC's mobile app. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce offers a great mobile app that can help you locate agritourism farms to visit. You can search by category if there is a specific type of farm that you want to visit, or you can search by location in the state. You can explore the types of activities offered by each farm and even get driving directions.

6. Have fun! Most importantly, have fun during your visit. Visiting an agritourism farm is not just about picking pumpkins or finding the perfect Christmas tree; it is about creating a unique and memorable experience.

Destructive Flooding Amidst a Drought

Uncontrollable factors of rain, drought, flooding, frost and a variety of severe storms are a few examples of battles that farmers face every day. Farmers not only have to monitor the weather in their area, but also the weather in other parts of the country. In Mississippi, farmers along the western side of the state must pay attention to weather that can affect the Mississippi River watershed.

The Mississippi River watershed collects waters from 7,000 streams reaching from New York to the Rocky Mountains. Forty percent of Continental US drains into the Mississippi River encompassing 31 states and two Canadian Provinces along its over 2,300 mile journey resembling a funnel to the Gulf of Mexico.

Louis Guedon of Louis Guedon Farms and Church Hill Produce knows first-hand the impact the thousands of tributaries have on the Mississippi River and his land. Guedon's family settled in Jefferson County, Miss. in 1866. Guedon himself has witnessed 100 year floods and a 500 year flood (2011) in his 40 plus years of farming. The flood in the spring of 2011 was the highest recorded flood in history on Guedon's south Mississippi farm; however, the flooding he experienced earlier in the summer of 2015 was the most devastating the farm has seen since its inception in the 1800s.

Tropical Storm Bill hit the Gulf Coast of Texas in June 2015 then proceeded north to Oklahoma and

east to Ohio. Rainfalls totaled more than 13 inches in some parts of the US, causing immediate flooding.

To avoid flooding, farmers across the country have improved fields to minimize ponding (water standing) on their property. When large storms, such as Bill, dump large amounts of rainfall, the land is designed to quickly drain the excess water. The water has to go somewhere; if in the Mississippi watershed, it will eventually drain into the Mississippi River, and Guedon's land is one of the receivers.

According to Guedon, large rainfalls from the north used to take 1-2 months before flowing past or on to the farm; now it only takes about 10 days. Within a week and a half, Guedon's soybeans and cotton were under water. The timing of this flood occurred in the middle of the growing season, when it is too late to replant and too early to harvest.

The further into the growing season, the more inputs that are added to maintain and produce a successful crop; therefore, the closer the farmer is to harvest when experiencing a drastic event like flooding, the more money the farmer loses. This is why Guedon has deemed this the most destructive flood to his operation, even though he did not see any rain directly from the storm.

Guedon has never seen a flood this late in August; neither have the four generations of family before him. The Guedon's have never missed a crop; this will be the first in 149 years. "It's sad to see one end of the field in drought and the other in flood on the same field on the same day," says Guedon.
