Color Choices Give Poinsettias Variety

Besides the Christmas tree, the poinsettia is the plant most often associated with the Christmas season. In their native Mexico, the bright red flowers of poinsettia are known as Flores de la Noche Buena— or Flowers of the Holy Night – as they bloom each year during the Christmas season.

If you're a fan of poinsettias but like variety, you'll find the range of poinsettia colors available is truly remarkable. Poinsettia is no longer simply "that red Christmas plant." Colors range from red and white to

even maroon for Bulldog fans, making it hard to choose. In addition to solid colors, there are bicolor, speckled and marbled poinsettias. There are even rose-flowered selections.

And if that's not enough, growers are changing the colors even more by painting and adding sparkles. When shopping for poinsettias, be ready for the wide variety of options and take your time to select the very best. Bracts should be completely colored and fully expanded. If not, the plants were probably shipped before they were completely ready.

You can hardly go wrong with these colorful "flowers" brightening your decorations. However, what we think of as flowers are actually modified leaves called bracts. The true flowers are the yellow/green bead-like structures called cyathia. Your poinsettia will last longer if you select plants with unopened or only partially opened cyathia.

In recent years, growers and florists have been using poinsettias in combination containers. *Southern Gardening* has promoted combining poinsettia with the Mississippi

chrysanthemum with a traditional red poinsettia.

Follow a few care tips to help keep your poinsettia looking good long after the Christmas holidays. Poinsettias need at least six hours of indirect sunlight and comfortable room temperatures. When grown in the greenhouse, the temperatures are about 72 degrees during the day and 60 degrees at night. The closer you get to providing these same temperatures, the longer your poinsettia will last.

Don't let the leaves or bracts touch window glass, as the low outside temperatures are readily transferred through the glass. Also, keep poinsettias away from frequently opened doors. It might look great by the front door when guests arrive, but if you want the plant to look great later, avoid the sudden temperature changes.

Temperatures below 50 degrees can harm the foliage and colorful bracts. On the way home with your

new poinsettias, be sure to cover them carefully, taking care not to break any branches or stems. Poinsettias are fragile, and stems can break quite easily from mishandling. Not only can the paper or plastic shipping sleeves hide damage, but you should pay particular attention when removing these. Never try to slide one over the plant, but always tear or cut the sleeve off.

The absolute most important thing to remember is DO NOT over-water your poinsettia. Poinsettias are sensitive to wet feet, and root rot sets in quickly. Make sure the potting mix feels dry to the touch before you water it. Remove the decorative sleeve around the pot, and water the top of the container over the kitchen sink. Replace the decorative sleeve after the water has finished draining.

Whichever colors and combinations you choose, be sure to brighten your Christmas celebrations with your favorite poinsettias.

Delightful Holiday Desserts



Sweet Potato Praline Pie

1 cup bran cereal, finely crushed
1/4 cup pecans, finely chopped
1 egg white, slightly beaten
2 cups sweet potatoes, mashed
1/4 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup granulated sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ginger
1 pinch cloves
1 egg, plus 1 egg yolk, slightly beaten
1 scant cup milk, 2% low-fat
Praline Sauce
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch
3/4 cup coffee
1 teaspoon butter
1/4 cup pecans, finely chopped

Combine the first three ingredients, press into bottom and sides of 9-inch pie tin lightly sprayed with nonstick spray (easiest to do with dampened hands). Bake in 400 degree F oven for 10 minutes. Mix sweet potatoes in electric mixer for 5 minutes until smooth. Add 1/4 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup granulated sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger, cloves and eggs; mix well to blend. At low speed, add milk until well blended. Pour into prepared shell and bake at 400 degrees F for 45 to 55 minutes or until knife inserted into filling comes out clean (center may be soft but will set when cool). Refrigerate pie until ready to serve. To prepare praline sauce, combine 1/2 cup brown sugar and cornstarch. Stir in coffee. Cook and stir until bubbly. Cook and stir for two minutes more. Add 1 teaspoon butter and stir until melted. Stir in pecans. Cut pie into 10 wedges. Serve with warm praline sauce, approximately five teaspoons per serving.

Hot Fudge Pudding Cake

1 cup all-purpose flour
1/3 cup sugar
1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup nonfat milk
1 large egg, slightly beaten
2 tablespoons canola oil
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/4 cup pecan halves, toasted
3/4 cup brown sugar
1 1/3 cups hot strong coffee

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Lightly coat an 8x8-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Stir together flour, sugar, cocoa, baking powder and salt in a large bowl. Combine milk, egg, oil and vanilla in a glass measuring cup. Make a well in center of the dry ingredients and gradually pour in the milk mixture, stirring until combined. Stir in pecans. Spoon into the prepared pan and spread evenly. Dissolve brown sugar in coffee; spoon over batter. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, about 25 minutes. Let stand for 10 minutes; serve hot or warm with vanilla frozen yogurt.

Holiday Angel Cake

1 cup cake flour
1 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup sugar substitute
12 egg whites
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1 1/2 teaspoons cream of tartar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup fresh cranberries or 1/2 cup dried cranberries
1 tablespoon finely chopped orange zest (or substitute lemon zest)

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Make sure your tube pan is clean and dry. Any trace amounts of oil could cause your whipped egg whites to deflate. Stir flour, 1/4 cup of sugar, and sugar substitute together in medium bowl and set aside. In a large mixing bowl, whip egg whites with the vanilla, cream of tartar, and salt together with mixer until medium-stiff peaks form. Gradually add the remaining sugar (3/4 cup) while continuing to whip to stiff peaks. When the egg whites have reached maximum volume, gradually fold in the flour mixture, one third at a time. Stir in one cup fresh cranberries or 1/2 cup dried cranberries and orange zest. Be careful not to overmix. Pour the batter in the prepared tube pan and bake 40-45 minutes or until cake springs back when touched. Balance the tube pan upside down on the top of a bottle to prevent decompression while cooling. When completely cool, run knife around the edge of the pan and invert onto a serving plate.

Cherry Berry Cheesecake Cobbler

16 ounces light or fat-free cream cheese
1/2 cup sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
1 large egg
2 egg whites, or 1/4 cup egg substitute
1 can light or regular cherry pie filling (20 ounces)
2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries
1 package yellow cake mix (about 4 cups)
1/2 cup low-fat lemon or vanilla yogurt

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Coat a 9x13-inch baking dish with canola cooking spray. Mix cream cheese, vanilla, and sugar in mixing bowl on medium speed until smooth. Add the egg and egg whites (or egg substitute) and blend well. Pour into prepared baking dish. In an eight cup measure or similar size container, gently stir the blueberries into the cherry pie filling. Spread the fruit topping evenly over the cream cheese mixture in baking dish. In the same 8 cup measure, blend cake mix and yogurt with a fork (mixture will be crumbly). Spread mixture over the fruit and cream cheese and bake for about 25 minutes. Let cool, then over and refrigerate until ready to serve.



A Christmas Train Story

I remember one of my brothers getting a train set with a big track one year for Christmas. It was a fascinating thing to watch the electric cars go around and around in a circle. My two-year-old girls are really into Thomas the Train and The Little Engine That Could right now.

Many Christmas scenes depict toy trains around the tree. Toy trains seem almost as important as the stockings hanging on the mantle. Trains and Christmas have “gone together” for generations. But what makes trains and Christmas go together? I do not remember the story of Mary and Joseph riding a train to Bethlehem. Nor has Santa ever been sighted delivering packages by rail.

Paul D. Race, who writes for FamilyGardenTrains.com and BigIndoorTrains.com, gives us the following three reasons for this:

- For over a century, to most Americans, “real trains” exemplified the kinds of “comings and goings,” “hustle and bustle,” and even package shipments, that increased dramatically during the holiday season. At any time of year, whether you took the “A-Train,” or the “Chattanooga Choo-Choo,” or whether you drifted home on a “Sentimental Journey,” you just assumed that any long trip would involve a train. This was even more true at Christmas time. The greatest examples were in the 1940s, when the railroads helped hundreds of thousands of GI’s to “Be Home for Christmas” year after year.

Let’s face it, more people and stuff move at Christmas than any other time of year, and for over a century, more people and stuff moved by trains than any other way. So for many people, Christmas seemed to

involve trains.

- In addition, as the importance of toy and model trains in American culture grew, so did the sense that Christmas was an ideal time both to give and to display those trains. This, in fact, will be the main topic of the following musings.

- Finally, trains running around Christmas trees bring back memories of simpler times. Christmas trains are to the soul what “comfort food” is to the appetite - a kind of reassurance that there are still good things in the world, and even good experiences in your own past. More will be said on that subject presently.

A portion of the rail section of the Agriculture and Forestry Museum is represented by four model railroad layouts constructed and operated by the volunteer efforts of the Central Mississippi Model Railroaders Association and the Red Caboose Crew. The layouts represent railroading in the late 1960’s and early 1970’s when steam locomotives were nearly replaced with modern diesel-electrics. The exhibit is unusual since all three of the popular model sizes are represented: N Scale, HO Scale, and O Gauges. The layouts depict the contribution of railroads to the development of agriculture and commerce in Mississippi.

The N Scale layout is a model of the Avery Loop. This was a privately owned railroad operated by Illinois Central serving the local industries in Jackson, Pearl and Flowood.

The HO Scale layout depicts Mississippi with a city area, logging area, a small rural town, catfish ponds and fields of production agriculture. Also shown are many of the rail side industries of the era including cotton gins, sawmills, vegetable shipping warehouses and railcar

icing facilities.

The O Gauge layout represents the varied topography of Mississippi along the Mississippi River. Also exhibited in this area is a full scale exhibit of a caboose. Visitors can get an appreciation of the size of prototype trains and, perhaps, imagine the feeling of standing on the porch of the caboose as the miles roll by.

Plan a trip to the Ag Museum this Christmas season. It’s a place of nostalgia, a collection of grand and simple things that families did and still do together that make special memories. Make it a Christmas tradition for your family. And Ag Museum memberships make great stocking stuffers!

The November 2014 fire has not stopped the Museum’s effort to teach the next generation about the importance of agriculture and the innovations our ancestors developed to feed, clothe, and house themselves. Rebuilding efforts are underway, as well as continuing efforts toward the master plan renovations which began in 2013. 



Animals Need Protection When Temperatures Drop

Although many pets and livestock grow heavy winter coats and have thick foot padding, they still need human protection when temperatures drop.

Here are some tips that pet owners and livestock producers can follow to keep their animals healthy and comfortable in extremely cold weather.

Dogs and cats, particularly those that live inside but often venture outdoors, are vulnerable when weather turns cold. They often need additional food and fresh water to maintain their body heat. Most large dogs can tolerate extremely cold temperatures if already acclimated to outside weather. Smaller-sized pets cannot.

Dogs that are kept outdoors should have a solid, protected doghouse or other shelter that keeps out wind, rain, snow and cold. The shelter should face south and have insulation, a blanket or hay for warmth. Keep bowls in an area that prevents water or food from freezing.

Protect your pets paws from salt. The salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate the pads of your pet's feet. Wipe all paws with a damp towel before your pet licks them and irritates his/her mouth.

Keep pets off icy surfaces to prevent injuries from slipping. As sure-footed as they are, dogs can slip on icy steps and tear or strain ligaments or aggravate hip problems. They could even break a bone. If you would not feel safe walking in an area, the dog shouldn't be doing it either.

Antifreeze and ice-melting chemicals often have a sweet taste. When these products accumulate in puddles on garage floors and sidewalks, the smell and taste often cause dogs



and cats to lick these products.

Antifreeze ingestion is one of the most common and lethal poisonings seen in pets during winter. As little as one teaspoon is often fatal to dogs and cats that ingest this poison. Symptoms of antifreeze ingestion include drunkenness, listlessness, frequent urination and vomiting. If an owner suspects a pet has consumed antifreeze, take the pet to a veterinarian immediately for emergency treatment.

Animals that stay outdoors, such as horses, cows, goats and sheep, require additional feed, fresh water and adequate shelter to keep warm and maintain good health. At a minimum, producers should install a windbreak to prevent additional body heat loss.

As temperatures begin to fall in the winter months, livestock require additional energy to stay warm. This additional energy requirement usually calls for changes or alterations in feeding practices. This means that when the temperature drops below

the critical temperature, the animals need to be fed better. It will be helpful to monitor weather forecasts to determine cold periods in advance and be able to increase the forage and additional supplements for the animals diet. Range meal, molasses tub products and protein blocks can help meet their energy requirements in extreme temperatures. Use caution when providing supplemental feed products to horses, and use products that are labeled for those animals.

Horses will better withstand winter weather if owners make sure their animals are prepared. The big thing is having the horse come into the winter months in tip-top shape. Horses should be up-to-date on vaccinations and on a good worming program throughout the winter months.

Regularly check horses feet, especially when the ground is muddy, because horses tend to get foot infections during wet months. While not all horses will need to be blanketed, blankets will help horses keep warm and dry, especially if there is any rain or snow. If you've body-clipped your horses, keep them blanketed throughout the winter. Horses that get blanketed can be susceptible to diseases and funguses that grow under the blanket, so remove the blanket regularly.

If horses spend a great deal of time in their stalls, make sure the area is safe, clean and free of mold and leaks. Buy quality hay and grain, and keep it covered. Feed your horses more forage, unlimited amounts if possible during extreme cold. This will help your horses create heat and regulate their body temperatures.

Extremely cold temperatures have a greater effect on livestock than humans, primarily because these animals live outdoors. Provide a healthy environment for your animals and use common sense to meet their needs during cold weather.



Game Meat Is Safe with Correct Prep, Cooking

The thrill may be in the hunt, but unless the game is kept clean and processed well, the meat won't bring pleasure to the palate.

Mississippi has a rich diversity of game animals for hunters to bag. As a result, many freezers across the state are full of venison, turkey, duck, squirrel and more, and recipes for how to prepare them are often passed down through families.

Bronson Strickland, Mississippi State University Extension Service wildlife biologist and associate professor in the MSU Forest and Wildlife Research Center, said the biggest priority is to keep game meat clean.

"It's very easy to get stomach and fecal content on the meat, so be very cautious when field dressing," Strickland said. "When you have access to clean water, be sure to wash the carcass thoroughly."

The next priority is to chill the harvested animal to a temperature below 40 degrees as soon as possible.

"Field dress big game like deer as soon as possible, then get the carcass to a cooler or processor," he said.

Brent Fountain, Extension human nutrition and food safety specialist, said hunters have plenty of time to chill carcasses on days when temperatures are about 40 degrees or lower. However, if the temperature is above 50 degrees, the meat must be chilled within three to four hours.

"Wild animals are exposed to a lot of microorganisms by being in an uncontrolled environment," Fountain said. "E. coli and salmonella are two bacteria of primary concern. Viruses such as norovirus and Hepatitis A can also be present, and wild game can also be infected with parasites."

Cooking the meat correctly prevents these from becoming problems. "For wild game, the recommenda-

tion is to reach an internal temperature of 160 degrees, and I've seen the recommendation to be even higher than that because of the risk," he said. "That's counterproductive in an animal that is really lean, because you will have a tougher piece of meat. To compensate, some people turn their venison into jerky, combine venison with fat products that allow it to be cooked at a higher temperature or choose moist cooking methods."

Fountain said game birds, such as turkeys and pheasants, should be cooked to an internal temperature as high as 180 degrees, but meat from these animals is typically not as tough.

Game animals have a tougher meat than commercially produced animals because of the conditions under which they live.

"Game animals are much more active, and by being active, they have a much higher muscle-to-fat ratio," Fountain said. "They're a lot leaner, and you have to compensate for that as you cook them."

In addition to using moist cooking methods, such as slow cooking or stews, game meat benefits from marinating or mechanical tenderizing. Aging the meat also tenderizes it, and some game processing facilities offer this service.

While some people like the distinct flavor of wild game, others prefer to minimize it. Fountain said the trick is to remove as much fat from the meat as possible.

"Game animals do have some fat, and this fat tends to become rancid quicker than commercially bought meat," he said. "A lot of the gamey flavor is in the fat, and the longer the fat stays on the meat, the more gamey that meat seems to be."

Soaking game meat in a saltwater brine can minimize the game flavor and enhance the overall flavor.
