51st Annual Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo

The much-anticipated Dixie National Rodeo begins on Thursday, February 11 and continues through Wednesday, February 17. The best of Smith, Harper and Morgan rodeo stock will be on display as cowboys and cowgirls compete for titles, prizes and pride. Special entertainers are featured at the conclusion of the rodeo each evening. This year's musical entertainment lineup includes Easton Corbin, Maddie & Tae, John Anderson, Joe Diffie, Frankie Ballard, 38 Special and Tyler Farr.

Don your boots, chaps and cowboy hats as the Dixie National Parade marches the downtown



streets of Jackson at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 13. This festive event includes an array of car clubs, floats, motorcycles, marching groups, horses, wagons, riding clubs, beauty queens and much more.

Preceding the rodeo and special events that accompany it, the Dixie National Junior Round-Up is a week-long series of exhibition and competition that is highly anticipated by thousands of 4-H and FFA youth each year. Many exhibitors purchase their animals several months in advance and spend countless hours working with these animals in order

to compete in district shows to earn the honor of competing in the Dixie National Junior Round-Up. Those that receive the "champion" title at Dixie National qualify to participate in the crowning glory of Mississippi's 4-H and FFA livestock programs, the Dixie National Sale of Junior Champions.

The road to the Sale of Junior Champions is a long one. First, youth exhibit their animals at one of the five district shows within the state. Exhibitors who receive a blue ribbon on their animal at a district show can then participate in Dixie National. Last year, there were over

1,600 market animals at the five district shows and over 1,100 made the cut for the Dixie National Junior Round-Up. From those 1,100 animals, the champions and reserve champions of the Junior Market Steer Show, the Junior Market Lamb Show, the Junior Market Swine Show, the Junior Mississippi Bred Barrow Show and the Junior Market Goat Show are singled out for a special tribute and are eligible for the Sale of Junior Champions where they will be auctioned to the highest bidder. Last year marked the 46th annual sale and set a new sale record with 43 animals sold for the gross total of \$382,595.

All of the young exhibitors with champions work long and hard to raise their outstanding animals, and the Sale of Junior Champions serves as a just reward for an exceptional job. Anna Wagner, 2015's Grand Champion Hog winner said, "It meant a lot to see my hard work toward my goal of winning the Dixie National Swine Show pay off, and then it's nice being recognized for that hard work through the Sale of Champions."

Behind the spotlight, the Dixie

National Sale of Junior Champions Promotion Committee is hard at work throughout the entire year in preparation for the sale. Committee members donate their time for fund-raising efforts and identifying donors to make the Sale of Junior Champions a success. In addition to raising funds that benefit youth participating in the sale, the committee also presents scholarships to exhibitors who do not have an animal in the sale. In 2015, the committee presented 35 youth with scholarships totaling \$55,500. This part of the program allows youth who excel in showing livestock as well as in academics to be rewarded for their hard work.

The 2016 Sale of Junior Champions will be held on Thursday, February 11. See pages 12 and 13 for a full schedule of events for the 51st annual Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo. 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From Our Kitchen To Yours

Riding the Trails and Campfire Favorites



Campfire Chicken

- Split chicken breast
- Red potatoes (cut in half)
- Carrots (cut in half)
- Onion (cut in half)
- Plum tomato (cut in half)

Place all of the ingredients into aluminum foil sheets, make into pockets. Add some seasonings of your choice. Bake in the oven or over a campfire for about an hour. If cooking over the fire, turn pockets frequently. Add a small ear of corn, if desired. It's a delicious full meal with no pots or dishes to clean.

Fire Me Up Sandwich

- Bread
- Butter
- Sliced meat (ham, chicken, beef, turkey)
- Shredded Cheese (Cheddar, Colby, Swiss)
- Sliced hot peppers (optional)
- Ranch dressing for dipping
- Aluminum foil

Cut a section of foil big enough to wrap your sandwich completely. Place the dull side of the foil up. Butter one slice of bread and place the butter side down on the foil. Layer your meat on the slice of bread. Place the sliced hot peppers on top of the meat. Sprinkle the cheese over the peppers. Butter the other slice of bread and place the slice butter side up on the sandwich. Wrap the sandwich in the foil making sure that you seal it completely. Lightly press the sandwich in the foil. Place on hot coals for approximately 3-4 minutes each side depending on how hot the coals are. Once done, unwrap sandwich, dip in ranch dressing and enjoy.

Campfire French Fries

- 4 potatoes, cut into strips
- 1-2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon margarine
- 2 tablespoons bacon bits
- Salt and pepper to taste

Place potato strips on a large square of heavy duty foil, dull side out. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and cheese. Shake a bit to coat. Dot potatoes with margarine and sprinkle with bacon bits. Seal the foil, leaving a steam vent on top. Grill over hot coals turning several times until potatoes are tender, about 30-40 minutes.

Super Fun Goopy Cones

- Sugar cones (for ice cream)
- Chunky or creamy peanut butter*
- Mini marshmallows
- Chocolate chips
- Bananas (cut into small chunks)
- Aluminum foil

These are fun to make in "assembly-line" fashion and let kids choose what they want in each cone. Place ingredients in separate bowls. *Use almond or cashew butter, if desired. Wrap the cones in foil. Place on grill above the heat for 5-10 minutes, turning occasionally. Carefully unwrap and enjoy. A great campfire dessert!

Cinnamon Pie

- 1 package refrigerated crescent roll dough
- Cinnamon/sugar mixture
- Butter
- Pie irons

Coat the pie irons with vegetable oil (you can use butter or margarine but the pies usually stick to the irons). Unroll the crescent roll dough and fill each half of the pie iron (1 package of dough will make 2 pies). Butter each piece of dough, pour a generous amount of cinnamon/sugar mixture onto one half and close the irons. Cook over the fire, turning frequently until golden brown, about 10 minutes.

Campfire Pizza

- 1 package large pita bread
- 1 can pizza sauce
- 3 slices salami
- 2 slices bacon, cut into small pieces
- 1 package shredded mozzarella cheese
- Sliced veggies (onions, peppers, mushrooms, zucchini)
- Aluminum foil

Spread pitas with sauce, sprinkle cheese on top. Place meat and veggies on top; place on aluminum foil over campfire grill (make sure the flame is not too high) or on top of low flame. Cook for about 10 minutes or until cheese is melted and bacon is cooked through. Watch closely as it cooks fast and can burn. When cooked over the campfire it tastes just like wood oven pizza!

Breakfast Mountain Pie

- Bacon
- Egg
- Cheese
- Bread
- Vegetable spray
- Pie irons

Spray pie irons with vegetable spray. Cut the bacon strips in half and lay them in the pie iron. Set one slice of bread on top of the bacon. Gently pat down the bread. Crack egg onto the bread. Lay cheese over top and cover with another slice of bread. Close pie iron and cook slowly over coals/fire. When the bacon is cooked, the egg inside will also be cooked.







The Spectacle of a Rodeo

This is the time of year when the Dixie National Rodeo comes to town. This is its fifty-first year. That means since 1965, we Mississippians have thought rodeo a worthy spectacle.

Have you ever stopped to wonder how professional rodeo came to be? When did somebody decide that riding wild horses or roping calves could be a spectator sport? I usually write about how hard people worked to survive in the early 1900's and how everything they had was valued and cared for with great struggle.

So who was the guy that decided to take the day off to see if he could ride a bull? I bet he said something along the lines of, "Y'all watch this!" I can only imagine.

We have a Charles Russell print hanging in our kitchen called *Roping a Grizzly*. The date on the painting depicting four cowboys, all horseback with ropes swinging, is 1903. All I can think every time I look at it is, "what do they think they are going to do with that bear when they catch it?" Mr. Russell painted from real subjects.

The skills cowboys and cowgirls exhibit at our modern day rodeos have a very useful purpose and rational background. In areas where cattle were (and still are) grazed on open range, ranchers identified their stock by brands. The following letter dated 1847 written by Captain Mayne Reid from Santa Fe, New Mexico, to a friend in Ireland, truly captures the origins of the 'spectacle' of a rodeo:

"At this time of year, the cowmen have what is called the round-up, when the calves are branded and the fat beasts selected to be driven to a fair hundreds of miles away. This round-up is a great time for the cowhand, a Donny-brook fair it is indeed. They contest with each other for the best roping and throwing, and there are horse races and whiskey and wines. At night in clear moonlight, there is dancing on the streets."

The first organized rodeo after the Civil War was held in Cheyenne, Wyoming in 1872. Between 1890 and 1910, rodeo became a public entertainment made popular through Wild West Shows and Fourth of July celebrations with Buffalo Bill Cody, Annie Oakley, and other charismatic stars lending their glamour and prestige to the exhibition.

I had the pleasure of attending Cheyenne Frontier Days several years ago. It had rained several inches, a thing that does not happen of-

ten on the high desert plains of Wyoming. The open-air arena was slick and muddy. The calf wrestlers made thick rooster tails with the heels of their boots, kind of like water skiers that day. A spectacle indeed!

The rodeo was not originally a sporting event, but an integral part of cattle-ranching in areas of Spanish influence. Many rodeo events are based on the real life tasks required by cattle ranching. While rodeo stresses its western folk hero image and its being a genuinely American creation, in fact, it grew out of the practices of Spanish ranchers and their Mexican ranch hands (vaqueros), originating with a mixture of cattle wrangling and bullfighting that dates back to the sixteenth-century conquistadors.

One of the activities introduced by the Spanish and incorporated into the sporting version of rodeo was bull riding. Another was steer wrestling, which involved wrestling the steer to the ground by riding up behind it, grabbing its tail, and twisting it to the ground. Bull wrestling was part of an ancient tradition throughout the ancient Mediterranean world including Spain. The ancient Minoans of Crete practiced bull jumping, bull riding, and bull wrestling. Bull wrestling may have been one of the Olympic sports events of the ancient Greeks.

So, then I surmise that rodeo is in fact a celebration of agricultural practice. One could make parallels to a harvest festival celebrating the bounty of the crop, a lumberjack competition to honor the best of the best who could wield a double-bladed ax, or a barn-raising where people gathered to help their neighbor. The Rodeo was, and still is, a community gathering borne of neighbors helping neighbors and skilled hands in friendly competition.

While you are in town for the Dixie National, take some time to visit the Ag Museum. Exhibits and displays depict early farm life in Mississippi and celebrate those who perfected agricultural practices leading the way for farmers and ranchers of today.

The Ag Museum is located at 1150 Lakeland Drive in Jackson and is open Monday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. In addition to our gallery and exhibit spaces, the Ag Museum also has room for your event, whether it's a meeting, a wedding or other special event. 



Prescribed Burn Workshop

The Mississippi State University Extension Service, the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station and the Mississippi Prescribed Fire Council are partnering to offer the event to introduce landowners to the benefits of prescribed burning and how to safely do it.

Topics of the workshop include the ecological impact, weather conditions, smoke management, burning techniques and liability issues. Presenters will demonstrate a live prescribed burn if weather permits.
